4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Section 1103.003, Occupations Code, is amended
6	by amending Subdivisions (2-a), (6-b), (7), and (8) and adding
7	Subdivisions (2-b), (4-a), and (5-a) to read as follows:
8	(2-a) <u>"Appraisal review" has the meaning assigned by</u>
9	<u>Section 1104.003.</u>
10	(2-b) "Appraisal Standards Board" means the Appraisal
11	Standards Board of the Appraisal Foundation, or its successor.
12	(4-a) "Appraiser trainee" means an appraiser trainee
13	licensed under this chapter.
14	(5-a) "Certified appraiser" means a person who is
15	certified under this chapter to practice as a certified general or
16	certified residential appraiser.
17	(6-b) "Federal financial institution regulatory
18	agency" means:
19	(A) the Board of Governors of the Federal Reserve
20	System;
21	(B) the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation;
22	(C) the Office of the Comptroller of the
23	Currency;
24	(D) the <u>Consumer Financial Protection Bureau</u>

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1	[Office of Thrift Supervision];
2	(E) the National Credit Union Administration; or
3	(F) the successors of any of those agencies.
4	(7) <u>"Licensed appraiser"</u> ["State-certified real
5	estate appraiser" or "certified appraiser" means a person who is
6	certified under this chapter.
7	[(8) "State-licensed real estate appraiser" or
8	"licensed appraiser"] means a person who is licensed under this
9	chapter to practice as a residential real estate appraiser.
10	(8) "Supervisory appraiser" means a supervisory
11	appraiser as defined by the Appraiser Qualifications Board.
12	SECTION 2. Section 1103.004, Occupations Code, is amended
13	to read as follows:
14	Sec. 1103.004. EFFECT OF CHAPTER. [(b)] This chapter does
15	not prohibit:
16	(1) a person authorized by law from performing an
17	evaluation of real property for or providing an evaluation of real
18	property to another person; [or]
19	(2) a real estate broker licensed under Chapter 1101
20	or a <u>sales agent</u> [salesperson] acting under the authority of a
21	sponsoring broker from providing to another person a written
22	analysis, opinion, or conclusion relating to the estimated price of
23	real property if the analysis, opinion, or conclusion:
24	(A) is not referred to as an appraisal;
25	(B) is given in the ordinary course of the
26	broker's [or salesperson's] business; and
27	(C) is related to the actual or potential

1 acquisition, disposition, encumbrance, or management of an 2 interest in real property; or

3 (3) an appraiser who is certified by a jurisdiction 4 other than this state from performing an appraisal review of an 5 appraisal performed on real property in this state, if the 6 appraiser does not offer an opinion of value as part of the 7 appraisal review.

8 SECTION 3. Section 1103.006, Occupations Code, is amended 9 to read as follows:

Sec. 1103.006. APPLICATION OF SUNSET ACT. 10 The Texas 11 Appraiser Licensing and Certification Board [If the federal government removes the requirements for the preparation or use of 12 an appraisal by federally regulated financial institutions, the 13 board] is subject to Chapter 325, Government Code (Texas Sunset 14 15 Act) [, and is subject to sunset review in the next regular session 16 of the legislature following the date of the federal government's action]. Unless continued in existence [by that legislature] as 17 provided by that chapter, the board is abolished and this chapter 18 and Chapter 1104 expire September 1, 2019 [expires on the 90th day 19 after the last day of the regular session of that legislature]. 20

21 SECTION 4. Subchapter B, Chapter 1103, Occupations Code, is 22 amended by adding Section 1103.0545 to read as follows:

7	(3) the results of the most recent formal audit of the
8	board;
9	(4) the requirements of laws relating to open
10	meetings, public information, administrative procedure, and
11	conflicts of interest; and
12	(5) any applicable ethics policies adopted by the
13	board or the Texas Ethics Commission.
14	(c) A person appointed to the board is entitled to
15	reimbursement for the travel expenses incurred in attending the
16	training program regardless of whether the attendance at the
17	program occurs before or after the person qualifies for office.
18	SECTION 5. Section 1103.055, Occupations Code, is amended
19	to read as follows:
20	Sec. 1103.055. TERMS; VACANCIES. (a) Appointed members of
21	the board serve staggered <u>six-year</u> [two-year] terms, with the terms
22	of <u>one or</u> two appraiser members and <u>one or</u> two public members
23	expiring on January 31 of each <u>odd-numbered</u> year.
24	(b) If a vacancy occurs during a member's term, the governor
25	shall appoint a person to fill the unexpired term [An appointed
26	member may not serve more than three consecutive two-year terms].
27	SECTION 6. Section 1103.056, Occupations Code, is amended

to read as follows: 1 Sec. 1103.056. OFFICERS; EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE. 2 (a) The governor shall designate a board member who is an appraiser to serve 3 4 as presiding officer of the board. 5 (b) At a regular meeting in February of each year, the board shall elect from its members an [a presiding officer,] assistant 6 7 presiding officer $[\tau]$ and <u>a</u> secretary. (c) [(b)] The presiding officer, assistant presiding 8 officer, and secretary [officers elected under Subsection (a)] 9 constitute the executive committee. 10 11 SECTION 7. Section 1103.057(c), Occupations Code, is amended to read as follows: 12 If the commissioner [presiding officer of the board] has 13 (c) knowledge that a potential ground for removal of an appointed board 14 member exists, the commissioner shall notify the presiding officer 15 16 of the board of the potential ground. 20 conference call or other video or broadcast technology.

21 SECTION 20. Section 1103.201, Occupations Code, is amended 22 to read as follows:

Sec. 1103.201. CERTIFICATE OR LICENSE REQUIRED. (a) A person may not perform an appraisal of real estate unless the person is licensed or certified as an appraiser under this chapter, registered as a temporary out-of-state appraiser under this chapter, or acting as an appraiser trainee under the <u>supervision</u>

1 [sponsorship] of a supervisory [certified] appraiser.

2 (b) Unless the person holds the appropriate license or3 certification, a person may not:

4 (1) use the title <u>"certified real estate appraiser"</u>
5 ["state-certified real estate appraiser"] or <u>"licensed real estate</u>
6 <u>appraiser"</u> ["state-licensed real estate appraiser"]; or

7 (2) refer to an appraisal performed by the person as a
8 "certified appraisal" or "licensed appraisal."

3	[ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS FOR LICENSE]. (a) An applicant for a
4	certificate or license or for renewal of a certificate or license
5	must submit an application to the board on the form prescribed by
6	the board.
7	(b) The applicant must disclose in the application whether
8	the applicant has:

20	agent [salesperson] or for professional development or continuing
21	education courses taken, whether the classroom hours or courses are
22	taken by a person as a real estate broker or <u>sales agent</u>
23	[salesperson] or as an employee of a financial institution engaged
24	in real estate-related financial transactions, if the classroom
25	hours or courses satisfy the requirements established by the
26	guidelines recognized by the Appraiser Qualifications Board.

An applicant [whose application is selected for 23 24 verification] has at least 60 days after the date notice is sent [of 25 selection] to submit [prepare] any records requested by the board. The board may not require the applicant to provide more information 26 27 than the information the board may obtain under Section 1103.207.

19 (2) the <u>applicant</u> [appraiser] holds a valid license or 20 certificate from a state whose requirements for licensure or 21 certification meet or exceed the licensure or certification 22 requirements of this state; [and]

(3) the <u>applicant</u> [appraiser] satisfies the board as
 to the appraiser's honesty, trustworthiness, and integrity; and

25 (4) the applicant complies with the requirements of 26 Sections 1103.203 and 1103.2031.

27 SECTION 29. Section 1103.2091, Occupations Code, is amended

1 to read as follows:

Sec. 1103.2091. PROBATIONARY CERTIFICATE <u>OR</u>[-] LICENSE[OR TRAINEE APPROVAL]. (a) The board may issue a probationary
certificate or license to [or approve] an appraiser or an appraiser
trainee, as applicable [on a probationary basis].

(b) The board by rule shall adopt reasonable terms for
issuing a probationary certificate or license [and for approval of
an appraiser trainee on a probationary basis].

9 (c) A person who holds a probationary certificate or license 10 [or who is approved as an appraiser trainee] under this section must 11 disclose the probationary status to all clients before accepting an 12 assignment.

13 SECTION 30. Sections 1103.211(b) and (c), Occupations Code, 14 are amended to read as follows:

22 (3) satisfying the board as to the person's honesty, 23 trustworthiness, and integrity; and

26 (c) For purposes of Subsection (b)(2), the board shall27 accept as continuing education any educational offering that

1 complies with the guidelines recognized by the Appraiser
2 Qualifications Board that a certified or licensed appraiser was
3 awarded by [a national appraiser organization approved by the board
4 as] a provider of qualifying appraisal education <u>approved by the</u>
5 board.

(d) If a person's certificate $\underline{or}[\tau]$ license[τ or approval] has been expired six months or longer, the person may not renew the certificate $\underline{or}[\tau]$ license[τ or approval]. The person may obtain a new certificate $\underline{or}[\tau]$ license[τ or approval] by complying with the

1 requirements and procedures for an original application.

2 SECTION 32. Sections 1103.213(a), (b), (c), (d), and (f),
3 Occupations Code, are amended to read as follows:

4 (a) The board may place on inactive status the certificate 5 or license of <u>a person who</u> [an appraiser if the appraiser]:

6 (1) is not acting as an appraiser or an appraiser
7 trainee;

8 (2) is not <u>acting as a supervisory appraiser of</u>
9 [sponsoring] an appraiser trainee; and

10 (3) submits a written application to the board before
11 the expiration date of the [appraiser's] certificate or license.
