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A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT relating to the practices and professions regulated by the Texas 2 Appraiser Licensing and Certification Board; requiring 3 an occupational license; imposing fees. 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 5 6 SECTION 1. Section 1103.003, Occupations Code, is amended by amending Subdivisions (2-a), (6-b), (7), and (8) and adding 7 Subdivisions (2-b), (4-a), and (5-a) to read as follows: 8 "Appraisal review" has the meaning assigned by 9 (2**-**a) Section 1104.003. 10 "Appraisal Standards Board" means the Appraisal 11 (2-b) 12 Standards Board of the Appraisal Foundation, or its successor. 13 (4-a) "Appraiser trainee" means an appraiser trainee licensed under this chapter. 14 (5-a) "Certified appraiser" means a person who is 15 16 certified under this chapter to practice as a certified general or certified residential appraiser. 17 (6-b) "Federal financial institution regulatory 18 agency" means: 19 the Board of Governors of the Federal Reserve 20 (A) 21 System; 22 (B) the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation; 23 (C) the Office of the Comptroller of the 24 Currency;

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1 (D) the Consumer Financial Protection Bureau 2 [Office of Thrift Supervision]; the National Credit Union Administration; or 3 (E) (F) the successors of any of those agencies. 4 5 "Licensed appraiser" ["State-certified real (7) estate appraiser" or "certified appraiser" means a person who is 6 7 certified under this chapter. [(8) "State-licensed real estate appraiser" 8 or "licensed appraiser"] means a person who is licensed under this 9 10 chapter to practice as a residential real estate appraiser. (8) "Supervisory appraiser" means a supervisory 11 12 appraiser as defined by the Appraiser Qualifications Board. SECTION 2. Section 1103.004, Occupations Code, is amended 13 14 to read as follows: 15 Sec. 1103.004. EFFECT OF CHAPTER. [(b)] This chapter does not prohibit: 16 17 (1) a person authorized by law from performing an evaluation of real property for or providing an evaluation of real 18 19 property to another person; [or] (2) a real estate broker licensed under Chapter 1101 20 or a sales agent [salesperson] acting under the authority of a 21 sponsoring broker from providing to another person a written 22 analysis, opinion, or conclusion relating to the estimated price of 23 24 real property if the analysis, opinion, or conclusion: 25 is not referred to as an appraisal; (A) 26 (B) is given in the ordinary course of the broker's [or salesperson's] business; and 27

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1 (C) is related to the actual or potential 2 acquisition, disposition, encumbrance, or management of an 3 interest in real property; or

4 <u>(3) an appraiser who is certified by a jurisdiction</u> 5 <u>other than this state from performing an appraisal review of an</u> 6 <u>appraisal performed on real property in this state, if the</u> 7 <u>appraiser does not offer an opinion of value as part of the</u> 8 <u>appraisal review.</u>

9 SECTION 3. Section 1103.006, Occupations Code, is amended 10 to read as follows:

Sec. 1103.006. APPLICATION OF SUNSET ACT. <u>The Texa</u>s 11 12 Appraiser Licensing and Certification Board [If the federal government removes the requirements for the preparation or use of 13 an appraisal by federally regulated financial institutions, the 14 15 board] is subject to Chapter 325, Government Code (Texas Sunset Act) [, and is subject to sunset review in the next regular session 16 17 of the legislature following the date of the federal government's action]. Unless continued in existence [by that legislature] as 18 19 provided by that chapter, the board is abolished and this chapter and Chapter 1104 expire September 1, 2019 [expires on the 90th day 20 21 after the last day of the regular session of that legislature].

22 SECTION 4. Subchapter B, Chapter 1103, Occupations Code, is 23 amended by adding Section 1103.0545 to read as follows:

1 complies with this section. 2 (b) The training program must provide the person with 3 information regarding: 4 (1) this chapter and other laws applicable to the 5 board; 6 (2) the programs, functions, rules, and budget of the 7 board; 8 (3) the results of the most recent formal audit of the 9 board; (4) the requirements of laws relating to open 10 meetings, public information, administrative procedure, and 11 12 conflicts of interest; and (5) any applicable ethics policies adopted by the 13 14 board or the Texas Ethics Commission. 15 (c) A person appointed to the board is entitled to reimbursement for the travel expenses incurred in attending the 16 training program regardless of whether the attendance at the 17 program occurs before or after the person qualifies for office. 18 19 SECTION 5. Section 1103.055, Occupations Code, is amended to read as follows: 20 Sec. 1103.055. TERMS; VACANCIES. (a) Appointed members of 21 the board serve staggered six-year [two-year] terms, with the terms 22 of one or two appraiser members and one or two public members 23 24 expiring on January 31 of each odd-numbered year. 25 If a vacancy occurs during a member's term, the governor (b) 26 shall appoint a person to fill the unexpired term [An appointed member may not serve more than three consecutive two-year terms]. 27

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SECTION 6. Section 1103.056, Occupations Code, is amended
to read as follows:

3 Sec. 1103.056. OFFICERS; EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE. (a) <u>The</u>
4 governor shall designate a board member who is an appraiser to serve
5 as presiding officer of the board.

6 (b) At a regular meeting in February of each year, the board 7 shall elect from its members <u>an</u> [a presiding officer,] assistant 8 presiding officer [7] and <u>a</u> secretary.

9 (c) [(b)] The presiding officer, assistant presiding 10 officer, and secretary [officers elected under Subsection (a)] 11 constitute the executive committee.

The method must include the review of 20 appraisal experience of all applicants for certification [and must 21 rely on appropriate sampling techniques that are applied to not 22 more than five percent of the license applications received by the 23 24 board]. An applicant [whose application is selected for verification] has at least 60 days after the date notice is sent [of 25 26 selection] to submit [prepare] any records requested by the board. The board may not require the applicant to provide more information 27

1 than the information the board may obtain under Section 1103.207.

2 SECTION 27. Section 1103.207(a), Occupations Code, is

9 an appraiser trainee on a probationary basis].

10 (c) A person who holds a probationary certificate or license 11 [or who is approved as an appraiser trainee] under this section must 12 disclose the probationary status to all clients before accepting an 13 assignment.

25 (d) If a person's certificate <u>or</u> $[-\tau]$ license $[-\tau]$ approval] 26 has been expired six months or longer, the person may not renew the 27 certificate <u>or</u> $[-\tau]$ license $[-\tau]$ approval]. The person may obtain a
