S.B. No. 1022

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

relating to an unsworn declaration made by a private process server in the performance of the server's job duties.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

SECTION 1. Section 132.001, Civil Practice and Remedies Code, is amended by amending Subsection (d) and adding Subsection (g) to read as follows:

(d) Except as provided by Subsections (e), ~~and~~ (f), and (g), an unsworn declaration made under this section must include a jurat in substantially the following form:

"My name is _____, my
(First) (Middle) (Last)
date of birth is _____, and my address is

and _____. I declare under penalty of

perjury that the foregoing is true and correct.

(g) An unsworn declaration made under this section by a

16 SECTION 2. Section 132.001(g), Civil Practice and Remedies
17 Code, as added by this Act, applies only to an unsworn declaration
18 executed on or after the effective date of this Act. An unsworn
19 declaration executed before the effective date of this Act is
20 governed by the law in effect immediately before the effective date
21 of this Act, and that law is continued in effect for that purpose.

22 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
