S.B. No. 1031

## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to a provisional license to practice funeral directing or 3 embalming. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4 5 SECTION 1. Section 651.302, Occupations Code, is amended to read as follows: 6 Sec. 651.302. APPLICATION; 7 ISSUANCE OF PROVISIONAL LICENSE. (a) The commission shall issue a provisional license to 8 practice funeral directing to an applicant who: 9 is at least 18 years of age; 10 (1) 11 (2) has completed the educational requirements of 12 Section 651.253 or is enrolled in an accredited school or college of mortuary science; 13 14 (3) is employed by a funeral establishment [director] to learn funeral directing [or embalming] under the instruction and 15 supervision of a [the] funeral director; 16 (4) files an application for a provisional license on 17 a form provided by the commission and verified under oath by the 18 applicant; [and] 19 20 (5) pays any required application or license fee; and 21 (6) complies with the requirements of this chapter and of the commission. 22 23 (b) The commission shall issue a provisional license to practice embalming to an applicant who: 24

1 (1)is at least 18 years of age; 2 (2) has completed the educational requirements of Section 651.253 or is enrolled in an accredited school or college of 3 mortuary science; 4 5 (3) is employed by a funeral establishment or 6 commercial embalming facility to learn embalming under the 7 instruction and supervision of an embalmer; 8 (4) files an application for a provisional license on a form provided by the commission and verified under oath by the 9 10 applicant; (5) [(4)] pays any required application or license 11 12 fee; and (6) [(5)] complies with the requirements of this 13 14 chapter and of the commission. 15 (c) The commission may waive the requirements of Subsection (a)(2) or (b)(2) for a period not to exceed 12 months and issue to an 16 17 applicant a provisional license that expires at the end of that period. 18 19 (d) An applicant must submit to a criminal background check before submitting an application for a license. 20 21 SECTION 2. Section 651.303, Occupations Code, is amended by adding Subsections (a-1) and (e-1) to read as follows: 22 23 (a-1) A provisional license holder may work only: 24 (1) in a funeral establishment or commercial embalming 25 facility licensed by the commission; and 26 (2) under the direct and personal supervision of a 27 funeral director or embalmer, as applicable.

(e-1) The commission by rule shall prescribe case reporting 1 requirements for provisional license holders. The commission shall 2 provide case report forms to be used by a provisional license 3 4 holder. 5 SECTION 3. The heading to Section 651.304, Occupations Code, is amended to read as follows: 6 Sec. 651.304. EMPLOYMENT NOTIFICATION [REPORTS]. 7 8 SECTION 4. Section 651.304, Occupations Code, is amended by amending Subsections (a) and (d) and adding Subsection (b) to read 9 10 as follows: (a) On entering employment with a funeral establishment or 11 12 commercial embalming facility [director or embalmer], а provisional license holder shall immediately notify the commission 13 14 of the name of the establishment or facility where [and place of 15 business of the funeral director or embalmer under whom] the provisional license holder will train. The funeral director or 16 17 embalmer in charge must [shall] sign the notification. (b) A provisional license holder must be employed by a 18

10 <u>(b) A provisional license holder must be employed by a</u> 19 <u>funeral establishment or commercial embalming facility, as</u> 20 <u>applicable, during the term of the provisional license. If a</u> 21 <u>provisional license holder is not employed as required by this</u> 22 <u>subsection, the commission shall cancel the provisional license.</u>

(d) If a provisional license holder leaves the employment of the funeral establishment or commercial embalming facility [<del>a</del> funeral director or embalmer], the funeral director or embalmer <u>in</u> charge shall prepare an affidavit showing the length of time the provisional license holder was employed and the number of cases

1 handled while employed by the funeral <u>establishment or facility</u> 2 [director or embalmer]. The <u>funeral director or embalmer shall</u> 3 <u>file the</u> original affidavit [shall be filed] with the commission <u>as</u> 4 [and made] a matter of record. <u>The funeral director or embalmer</u> 5 <u>shall provide a</u> [A] copy of the affidavit [shall be furnished] to 6 the provisional license holder.

SECTION 5. Subchapter G, Chapter 651, Occupations Code, is
amended by adding Section 651.3045 to read as follows:

9 Sec. 651.3045. TERM OF PROVISIONAL LICENSE. (a) Except as
 10 provided by Subsection (c), a provisional license is valid for 12
 11 consecutive months and may be renewed only once for a period not to
 12 exceed an additional 12 consecutive months.

13 (b) The commission shall cancel a provisional license if the 14 license holder fails to complete the licensing requirements of the 15 provisional license program within 24 consecutive months.

16 (c) If a provisional license holder holds a provisional 17 license issued under Section 651.302(c), the provisional license 18 may be renewed for a period not to exceed 24 consecutive months and 19 the provisional license holder must complete the licensing 20 requirements of the provisional license program within 36 21 consecutive months.

SECTION 6. Section 651.305, Occupations Code, is amended by amending Subsections (c) and (d) and adding Subsections (d-1), (d-2), and (d-3) to read as follows:

(c) If a provisional license holder fails to <u>renew the</u> provisional license [timely pay the renewal fee], the commission shall:

No. 1031 impose a late payment penalty equal to the amount 1 (1)of the license renewal fee; 2 3 (2) suspend the license for nonpayment; and 4 (3) notify the provisional license holder of the 5 suspension. (d) If the renewal fee and penalty are not paid before the 6 7 91st day after the date of the notice of suspension, the commission 8 shall cancel the license. 9 (d-1) If the license is canceled under Subsection (d) [this 10 subsection], the provisional license holder may apply for reinstatement not later than the date the license would have 11 12 expired if the license had been renewed [not later than 18 months after the date of cancellation]. The commission may reinstate the 13 14 canceled license if: 15 (1) all other commission requirements are satisfied; 16 and 17 (2) the license fee and a late payment penalty equal to the amount of the license fee for the period of the cancellation are 18 19 paid. (d-2) A reinstated license expires on the date the license 20 would have expired if the license had been timely renewed. 21 (d-3) A provisional license holder may not work as a funeral 22 director or embalmer while the license is suspended or canceled. 23 24 SECTION 7. Subchapter G, Chapter 651, Occupations Code, is amended by adding Section 651.3055 to read as follows: 25 26 Sec. 651.3055. REAPPLICATION FOR PROVISIONAL LICENSE. (a) A person who does not complete the provisional license program 27

within the prescribed period may reapply for a provisional license. 1 2 (b) A person who reapplies for a provisional license must comply with the requirements of Section 651.303. Casework performed 3 4 under a previous provisional license may not be counted toward the requirements for the new provisional license. The commission may 5 6 adopt rules to allow casework performed under a previous 7 provisional license to transfer to a new provisional license if the 8 license holder requests a hardship exemption. 9 (c) A person may reapply for a provisional license under this section only once. 10 SECTION 8. The following sections of the Occupations Code 11 12 are repealed: Sections 651.303(b) and (c); 13 (1) Section 651.304(e); and 14 (2) 15 (3) Sections 651.305(e) and (f). 16 SECTION 9. This Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
