2	relating to law enforcement training programs and policies on using
3	appropriate nonlethal force and nonviolent restraint; changing the
4	education requirements for licensure as a peace officer.
5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
6	SECTION 1. Article 2.13, Code of Criminal Procedure, is
7	amended by adding Subsection (d) to read as follows:
8	(d) A peace officer shall:
9	(1) use all reasonable means to avoid using deadly
10	force against an unarmed suspect; and
11	(2) use the least amount of force necessary to
12	restrain an uncooperative suspect, if practicable.
13	SECTION 2. Chapter 2, Code of Criminal Procedure, is
14	amended by adding Article 2.139 to read as follows:
15	Art. 2.139. POLICIES ON APPROPRIATE USE OF FORCE. (a) In
16	this article, "law enforcement agency" means an agency of the

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- state, or of a county, municipality, or other political subdivision 17
- 18 of the state, that employs peace officers.
- 19 (b) Each law enforcement agency in this state shall adopt a
- 20 policy on the appropriate use of force by officers.
- (c) The policy must include: 21
- 22 (1) guidance on the relevant laws regarding the use of
- deadly force; 23
- 24 (2) procedures for dealing with armed and unarmed

- 1 suspects;
- 2 (3) specific techniques to restrain or subdue a
- 3 suspect without the use of deadly force or restraint that causes
- 4 significant bodily injury; and
- 5 (4) disciplinary sanctions to be taken against an
- 6 officer who violates the policy.
- 7 (d) As appropriate, the policy must provide examples of
- 8 specific situations that an officer may encounter and the
- 9 recommended course of action for each situation.
- 10 SECTION 3. Section 1701.253, Occupations Code, is amended
- 11 by adding Subsection (1) to read as follows:
- 12 (1) As part of the minimum curriculum requirements, the
- 13 commission shall require an officer to complete a training program
- 14 on nonlethal force and nonviolent restraint established by the
- 15 commission under Section 1701.2532.
- SECTION 4. Subchapter F, Chapter 1701, Occupations Code, is
- 17 amended by adding Section 1701.2532 to read as follows:
- 18 Sec. 1701.2532. NONLETHAL FORCE AND NONVIOLENT RESTRAINT
- 19 TRAINING PROGRAM. (a) The commission shall establish a statewide
- 20 comprehensive education and training program on the use of
- 21 nonlethal force and nonviolent restraint. The training program
- 22 must consist of at least eight hours of classroom instruction and
- 23 practical training in:
- 24 (1) the appropriate use of force in the continuum of
- 25 situations faced by an officer, including when faced with an
- 26 unarmed suspect;
- 27 (2) the relevant state and federal law relating to

- 1 force and deadly force;
- 2 (3) the use of a nightstick, baton, or similar club for
- 3 nonviolent restraint in a manner intended to minimize bodily injury
- 4 to the suspect;
- 5 (4) the use of pepper spray for subduing a suspect
- 6 without using lethal force; and
- 7 (5) the use of any other weapons or methods that the
- 8 <u>commission determines by rule.</u>
- 9 (b) The training program may not be provided as an online
- 10 course.
- 11 (c) At least once every three years, the commission shall
- 12 review the content of the training program under this section and
- 13 update the program as necessary.
- 14 (d) Except as provided by Section 1701.352(b-1), an officer
- 15 who completes the training program established under this section
- 16 <u>is not required to retake the program.</u>
- 17 (e) Each officer who has not completed the training program
- 18 as required by Section 1701.253(1) shall complete the training
- 19 program not later than September 1, 2017.
- 20 (f) Subsection (e) and this subsection expire January 1,
- 21 2019.
- SECTION 5. Section 1701.256, Occupations Code, is amended
- 23 to read as follows:
- Sec. 1701.256. INSTRUCTION IN WEAPONS PROFICIENCY
- 25 REQUIRED. A peace officer training program under Section
- 26 1701.251(a) must provide instruction in weapons proficiency. The
- 27 instruction must include training in the use of a nightstick,

- 1 baton, or similar club, pepper spray, and any other weapon the
- 2 commission determines by rule.
- 3 SECTION 6. Section 1701.352, Occupations Code, is amended
- 4 by adding Subsection (b-1) to read as follows:
- 5 (b-1) The commission shall require each officer to complete
- 6 the training program on nonlethal force and nonviolent restraint
- 7 established by the commission under Section 1701.2532 at least once
- 8 every 36 months.
- 9 SECTION 7. Each law enforcement agency in this state shall
- 10 adopt the policy required by Article 2.139, Code of Criminal
- 11 Procedure, as added by this Act, not later than January 1, 2016.
- 12 SECTION 8. Not later than January 1, 2016, the Texas
- 13 Commission on Law Enforcement shall establish the training program
- 14 on nonlethal force and nonviolent restraint as required by Section
- 15 1701.2532, Occupations Code, as added by this Act.
- SECTION 9. This Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
