A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT

- 2 relating to a study of economically recyclable materials, economic
- 3 impacts to the state and local governments of existing and
- 4 increased recycling, the development of new markets for recycled
- 5 materials and any infrastructure needs, and the potential to
- 6 increase state revenues.
- 7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 8 SECTION 1. DEFINITIONS. In the Act:
- 9 (1) "Commission" means the Texas Commission on
- 10 Environmental Quality.
- 11 (2) "Recycling" has the meaning assigned by Section
- 12 361.421, Health and Safety Code.
- SECTION 2. ADVISORY COMMITTEE; STUDY. (a) The commission
- 14 shall convene an advisory committee established under Chapter 361,
- 15 Health and Safety Code.
- 16 (b) The commission through the advisory committee shall
- 17 conduct a study quantifying the amount of materials currently being
- 18 recycled, economic impacts including lost state and local revenues
- 19 from the materials that are not being recycled, and to identify ways
- 20 to develop new markets to increase recycling. The study must:
- 21 (1) assess current recycling efforts and identify ways
- 22 in which the private and public sectors can improve and increase
- 23 those efforts;
- 24 (2) Identify new markets and business that may be

- 1 available from existing and increased recycling of materials;
- 2 (3) investigate available and new funding for efforts
- 3 that are identified;
- 4 (4) assess current associated jobs and additional job
- 5 creation opportunities with existing and increased recycling; and
- 6 (5) assess rural infrastructure needs and development
- 7 opportunities.
- 8 (c) The advisory committee shall prepare a written report on
- 9 the results of the study, and submit the report to the commission
- 10 for inclusion into the Municipal Solid Waste Annual Summary Report.
- 11 SECTION 5. EXPIRATION. This Act expires August 31, 2017.
- 12 SECTION 6. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Act takes effect
- 13 immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members
- 14 elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas
- 15 Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for
- 16 immediate effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
