A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

- 2 relating to the authority of certain municipalities to pledge
- 3 revenue from the municipal hotel occupancy tax for the payment of
- 4 obligations related to hotel projects.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Section 351.102(b), Tax Code, is amended to read
- 7 as follows:
- 8 (b) An eligible central municipality, [or] a municipality
- 9 with a population of 173,000 or more that is located within two or
- 10 more counties, or a municipality with a population of 96,000 or more
- 11 that is located in a county that borders Lake Palestine may pledge
- 12 the revenue derived from the tax imposed under this chapter from a
- 13 hotel project that is owned by or located on land owned by or that
- 14 will be owned by the municipality or, in an eligible central
- 15 municipality, by a nonprofit corporation acting on behalf of an
- 16 eligible central municipality, and that is located within 1,000
- 17 feet of a convention center facility owned by the municipality for
- 18 the payment of bonds or other obligations issued or incurred to
- 19 acquire, lease, construct, and equip the hotel and any facilities
- 20 ancillary to the hotel, including convention center
- 21 entertainment-related facilities, meeting spaces, public spaces,
- 22 including open public spaces used for connectivity, plazas,
- 23 restaurants, shops, street and water and sewer infrastructure, and
- 24 parking facilities within 1,000 feet of the hotel or convention

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- 1 center facility. For bonds or other obligations issued under this
- 2 subsection, an eligible central municipality or a municipality
- 3 <u>described by this subsection</u> [with a population of 173,000 or more
- 4 that is located within two counties] may only pledge revenue or
- 5 other assets of the hotel project benefiting from those bonds or
- 6 other obligations.
- 7 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 8 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 9 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 10 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 11 Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
