BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 5 6 SECTION 1. Subchapter B, Chapter 531, Government Code, is 7 amended by adding Section 531.02177 to read as follows: Sec. 531.02177. AUTISM SPECTRUM DISORDER TELEPRACTICE 8 PILOT PROJECT. (a) In this section, "telepractice" means the use 9 of telecommunications technology to facilitate a diagnosis or 10 intervention. 11 12 (b) The commission shall develop and implement a six-year pilot project in which evidence-based diagnostic and intervention 13 14 services are provided to children and adults with an autism spectrum disorder by telepractice by certain physicians and health 15 16 and other professionals. (c) The executive commissioner shall adopt rules necessary 17 to develop and implement the pilot project under this section. The 18 19 rules adopted under this section: (1) must allow a service provider to be physically 20 located at and provide services from any site located in or 21 associated with the autism centers at the following institutions: 22 23 (A) The University of Texas Health Science Center at Houston; 24

2	or a medically underserved area as a condition of participating in

No. 1119 1 (D) a licensed specialist in school psychology; 2 (E) a certified educational diagnostician; (F) an early childhood intervention services 3 provider who is not credentialed to provide qualified mental health 4 5 professional community services; 6 (G) a registered or licensed vocational nurse who 7 is not credentialed to provide qualified mental health professional 8 community services; 9 (H) a board certified behavior analyst; 10 (I) a speech-language therapist; 11 (J) an occupational therapist; 12 (K) a physical therapist; 13 (L) a person who conducts home visits under the 14 Maternal, Infant, and Early Childhood Home Visiting Program; or 15 (M) a promotora, as defined by Section 48.001, 16 Health and Safety Code; 17 (8) must require that a service provider maintain all records relating to the service provider's telepractice 18 19 interaction with a participant and provide copies of those records 20 to the participant; and 21 (9) may not require a person present at a site where a 22 participant is receiving services to maintain records relating to a service provider's telepractice interaction with the participant 23 24 that are created at the site where the service provider is located. (d) Not later than December 1, 2022, the commission shall 25 26 submit a report to the legislature evaluating the pilot project. The report required by this subsection may be submitted 27

(e) This section expires September 1, 2023.

3 SECTION 2. Not later than December 1, 2015, the executive 4 commissioner of the Health and Human Services Commission shall 5 adopt the rules required by Section 531.02177, Government Code, as 6 added by this Act.

7 SECTION 3. Not later than January 1, 2016, the Health and 8 Human Services Commission shall ensure that the pilot project 9 required by Section 531.02177, Government Code, as added by this 10 Act, is in operation.

SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
