A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to monetary assistance provided by the Department of
- 3 Family and Protective Services to certain relatives and designated
- 4 caregivers.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Section 264.755, Family Code, is amended by
- 7 amending Subsection (b) and adding Subsection (f) to read as
- 8 follows:
- 9 (b) Monetary assistance provided under this section must
- 10 include a one-time cash payment to the caregiver on the initial
- 11 placement of a child or a sibling group. The amount of the cash
- 12 payment, as determined by the department, may not exceed \$1,000 for
- 13 each child. The payment for placement of a sibling group must be at
- 14 least \$1,000 for the group, but may not exceed \$1,000 for each child
- 15 in the group. The cash payment must be provided not later than the
- 16 60th day after the date of [on] the initial placement of each child
- 17 with the caregiver and is provided to assist the caregiver in
- 18 purchasing essential child-care items such as furniture and
- 19 clothing.
- 20 <u>(f) The department shall reimburse a relative or other</u>
- 21 designated caregiver annually for expenses permitted under
- 22 Subsection (c)(6). The initial reimbursement shall occur no later
- 23 than six months after placement of a child or sibling group.
- SECTION 2. (a) Section 264.755(b), Family Code, as amended

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- 1 by this Act, applies only to monetary assistance with respect to a
- 2 child who is initially placed with a relative or other designated
- 3 caregiver on or after the effective date of this Act. Monetary
- 4 assistance with respect to a child who is initially placed with a
- 5 relative or other designated caregiver before that date is governed
- 6 by the law in effect on the date of the initial placement, and the
- 7 former law is continued in effect for that purpose.
- 8 (b) Section 264.755(f), Family Code, as added by this Act,
- 9 applies only to the reimbursement of a relative or other designated
- 10 caregiver for expenses for which a completed request for
- 11 reimbursement is submitted to the Department of Family and
- 12 Protective Services on or after the effective date of this Act.
- 13 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
