Sections 74.051(b), (c), (d), and (e), 6 Government Code, are amended to read as follows: 7 Except as provided by Subsection (c), a presiding judge (b) 8 shall receive an annual [a] salary from the state not to exceed that is 28 percent of the annual state salary of a district judge 9 [\$33,000 a year. The Texas Judicial Council shall set the salary 10 biennially and, in arriving at the amount of the salary, shall 11 consider whether the presiding judge is active in administrative 12 13 duties, performs part time, or is a retired judge. The salary set by the Texas Judicial Council shall be apportioned to each county in 14 15 the region according to the population of the counties comprising the region and shall be paid through the county budget process]. 16 A presiding judge who is a retired or former district 17 (c)
