A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT 2 relating to suicide prevention training for educators in public 3 schools. Δ BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: SECTION 1. This Act may be cited as the Jason Flatt Act in 5 6 memory of Jonathan Childers. SECTION 2. Section 21.451, Education Code, is amended by 7 8 amending Subsection (d) and adding Subsections (d-1) and (d-2) to read as follows: 9 10 (d) The staff development: may include training in: 11 (1) 12 (A) technology; 13 (B) conflict resolution; 14 (C) discipline strategies, including classroom 15 management, district discipline policies, and the student code of conduct adopted under Section 37.001 and Chapter 37; and 16 preventing, identifying, responding to, and 17 (D) reporting incidents of bullying; [and] 18 subject to Subsection (e) and to Section 21.3541 19 (2) and rules adopted under that section, must include training based 20 on scientifically based research, as defined by Section 9101, No 21 22 Child Left Behind Act of 2001 (20 U.S.C. Section 7801), that: 23 (A) relates to instruction of students with 24 disabilities; and

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1 is designed for educators who work primarily (B) 2 outside the area of special education; and 3 (3) must include at least two hours of suicide 4 prevention training that must be provided: 5 (A) on an annual basis, as part of a new employee orientation, to all new school district and open-enrollment charter 6 7 school educators; and 8 (B) to existing school district and 9 open-enrollment charter school educators on a schedule adopted by the agency by rule. 10 11 (d-1) The suicide prevention training required by Subsection (d)(3) must use a best practice-based program 12 recommended by the Department of State Health Services in 13 coordination with the agency under Section 161.325, Health and 14 Safety Code. 15 16 (d-2) The suicide prevention training required by Subsection (d)(3) may be satisfied through independent review of 17 suicide prevention training material that: 18 (1) complies with the guidelines developed by the 19 20 agency; and (2) is offered online. 21 22 SECTION 3. This Act applies beginning with the 2015-2016 23 school year. 24 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 25 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 26 27 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this

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1 Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
