A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT

- 2 relating to excluding certain students from the computation of
- 3 dropout and completion rates for purposes of public school
- 4 accountability of open-enrollment charter schools.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Section 39.053(g-1), Education Code, is amended
- 7 to read as follows:
- 8 (g-1) In computing dropout and completion rates under
- 9 Subsection (c)(2), the commissioner shall exclude:
- 10 (1) students who are ordered by a court to attend a
- 11 high school equivalency certificate program but who have not yet
- 12 earned a high school equivalency certificate;
- 13 (2) students who were previously reported to the state
- 14 as dropouts, including a student who is reported as a dropout,
- 15 reenrolls, and drops out again, regardless of the number of times of
- 16 reenrollment and dropping out;
- 17 (3) students in attendance who are not in membership
- 18 for purposes of average daily attendance;
- 19 (4) students whose initial enrollment in a school in
- 20 the United States in grades 7 through 12 was as unschooled refugees
- 21 or asylees as defined by Section 39.027(a-1);
- 22 (5) students who are <u>detained at a county detention</u>
- 23 facility and:
- 24 (A) in the district exclusively as a function of

- 1 having been detained at the [a county detention] facility but are
- 2 otherwise not students of the district in which the facility is
- 3 located; or
- 4 (B) provided services by an open-enrollment
- 5 charter school exclusively as the result of having been detained at
- 6 the facility; and
- 7 (6) students who are incarcerated in state jails and
- 8 federal penitentiaries as adults and as persons certified to stand
- 9 trial as adults.
- SECTION 2. This Act applies beginning with the 2015-2016
- 11 school year.
- 12 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 13 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 14 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 15 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 16 Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
