Section 383.5, 386.72, 392.5, 392.9a, 395.13, or 396.9, a 9 law compatible with those federal regulations, or the North 10 11 American Standard Out-of-Service Criteria. (23-a) "Person" includes the United States, a state, 12 13 or a political subdivision of a state. (25) "Serious traffic violation" means: 14 15 (A) a conviction arising from the driving of a 16 motor vehicle, other than a parking, vehicle weight, or vehicle defect violation, for: 17 18 (i) excessive speeding, involving a single charge of driving 15 miles per hour or more above the posted speed 19 20 limit; (ii) reckless driving, as defined by state 21 or local law; 22 (iii) a violation of a state or local law 23 related to motor vehicle traffic control, including a 24 law regulating the operation of vehicles on highways, arising in 25 connection with a fatal accident; 26 27 (iv) improper or erratic traffic lane

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1 change; 2 (v) following the vehicle ahead too closely; [<del>or</del>] 3 4 (vi) a violation of Section [Sections] 5 522.011 or 522.042; or 6 (vii) a violation of a state or local law or 7 ordinance prohibiting texting while driving or restricting or prohibiting the use of a wireless communication device while 8 9 operating a commercial motor vehicle; or a violation of Section 522.015. 10 (B) 11 SECTION 2. Section 522.011, Transportation Code, is amended by amending Subsection (a) and adding Subsections (e) and (f) to 12 read as follows: 13 A person may not drive a commercial motor vehicle 14 (a) 15 unless: 16 (1)the person: 17 (A) has in the person's immediate possession a commercial driver's license issued by the department appropriate 18 for the class of vehicle being driven; and 19 20 (B) is not disqualified or subject to an out-of-service order; 21 (2) the person: 22 has in the person's immediate possession a 23 (A) commercial [driver] learner's permit and driver's license issued by 24 25 the department; and is accompanied by the holder of a commercial 26 (B) 27 driver's license issued by the department with any necessary

1 endorsements appropriate for the class of vehicle being driven, and 2 the license holder: 3 (i) for the purpose of giving instruction 4 in driving the vehicle, at all times occupies a seat beside the permit holder or, in the case of a passenger vehicle, directly 5 behind the driver in a location that allows for direct observation 6 7 and supervision of the permit holder [for the purpose of giving instruction in driving the vehicle]; and 8 9 (ii) is not disqualified or subject to an 10 out-of-service order; or 11 (3) the person is authorized to drive the vehicle under Section 522.015. 12 13 (e) It is a defense to prosecution for a violation of Subsection (a)(2)(A) if the person charged produces in court a 14 commercial learner's permit or driver's license, as appropriate, 15 16 that: 17 (1) was issued to the person; and (2) was valid when the offense was committed. 18 (f) The court may assess a defendant an administrative fee 19 20 not to exceed \$10 if a charge under this section is dismissed because of the defense listed under Subsection (e). 21 22 SECTION 3. Section 522.013, Transportation Code, is amended to read as follows: 23 Sec. 522.013. 24 NON-DOMICILED [<del>NONRESIDENT</del>] LICENSE OR (a) The department may issue non-domiciled 25 PERMIT. а [nonresident] commercial driver's license or commercial learner's 26 27 permit to a person domiciled in [resident of] a foreign

1 jurisdiction if the secretary has determined that the commercial 2 motor vehicle testing and licensing standards in the foreign 3 jurisdiction do not meet the testing standards established by 49 4 C.F.R. Part 383.

(b) An applicant <u>for a non-domiciled commercial driver's</u>
<u>license</u> must surrender any <u>non-domiciled</u> [<del>nonresident</del>] commercial
driver's license issued by another state.

Before issuing a non-domiciled [nonresident] commercial 8 (c) 9 driver's license, the department must establish the practical capability of disqualifying the person under the conditions 10 11 applicable to a commercial driver's license issued to a resident of this state. Before issuing a non-domiciled commercial learner's 12 13 permit, the department must establish the practical capability of disqualifying the person under the conditions applicable to a 14 15 commercial learner's permit issued to a resident of this state.

16 (d) <u>"Non-domiciled"</u> [<u>"Nonresident"</u>] must appear on the face 17 of a license <u>or permit</u> issued under this section.

18 (e) The department may issue a temporary non-domiciled [nonresident] commercial driver's license to a person who does not 19 20 present а social security card as required by Section 522.021(a-1)(1) but who otherwise meets the requirements for a 21 non-domiciled [nonresident] commercial driver's license, including 22 the requirement that the commercial motor vehicle testing and 23 24 licensing standards of the country of which the applicant is 25 domiciled [a resident] not meet the testing and licensing standards established by 49 C.F.R. Part 383. A license issued under this 26 27 subsection:

1 expires on the earlier of: (1) 2 (A) the 60th day after the date the license is issued; or 3 4 (B) [the expiration date of the visa presented 5 under Section 522.021(a-1)(2)(B); or 6 [(C)] the expiration date of any [the] Form I-94 7 Arrival/Departure record, or a successor document, presented under Section 522.021(a-1) [522.021(a-1)(2)(C)]; and 8 9 (2) may not be renewed. 10 (f) The department may not issue more than one temporary 11 <u>non-domiciled</u> [nonresident] commercial driver's license to a 12 person. SECTION 4. Section 522.014, Transportation Code, is amended 13 to read as follows: 14 15 Sec. 522.014. PERMIT. (a) The department may issue a 16 commercial [driver] learner's permit to an individual who: 17 (1) has been issued a driver's license by the department; and 18 (2) has passed the vision and written tests required 19 for [a Texas driver's license appropriate for] the class of vehicle 20 to be driven. 21 22 (b) A commercial learner's permit must be a separate document from a driver's license or a commercial driver's license. 23 (c) The issuance of a commercial learner's permit is 24 25 required for: 26 (1) the initial issuance of a commercial driver's 27 license; or

8 SECTION 8. Section 522.023, Transportation Code, is amended 9 by adding Subsection (j) to read as follows:

10 (j) The department may administer a skills test to a person 11 who holds a commercial learner's permit issued by another state or 12 jurisdiction.

SECTION 9. Section 522.025, Transportation Code, is amended to read as follows:

LIMITATIONS ON ISSUANCE OF LICENSE OR PERMIT. 16 (a) The department may not issue a commercial driver's license or 17 commercial [driver] learner's permit to a person who is 18 disqualified from driving a commercial motor vehicle or while the 19 person's driver's license or driving privilege is suspended, 20 revoked, or canceled in any state.

(b) The department may not issue a commercial driver's license to a person who has a driver's license, commercial driver's license, or commercial [driver] learner's permit issued by another state unless the person surrenders the license or permit. The department shall <u>notify</u> [return a surrendered license or permit to] the issuing state <u>of the surrendered license or permit</u> [for <u>cancellation</u>].

1 SECTION 10. Section 522.027, Transportation Code, is

8 Sec. 522.028. CHECK OF DRIVING RECORD. Before issuing a 9 commercial driver's license <u>or commercial learner's permit</u>, the 10 department shall check the applicant's driving record as required 11 by 49 C.F.R. Section 383.73.

12 SECTION 12. Section 522.029, Transportation Code, is 13 amended by amending Subsections (a), (b), (c), (h), (j), and (k) and 14 adding Subsections (h-1) and (l) to read as follows:

(a) The fee for a commercial driver's license [or commercial

5 (k) The fee for a <u>non-domiciled</u> [<del>nonresident</del>] commercial 6 driver's license <u>or a non-domiciled commercial learner's permit</u> is 7 \$120. The fee for a temporary <u>non-domiciled</u> [<del>nonresident</del>] 8 commercial driver's license is \$20.

9 (1) The fee for the administration of a skills test to a 10 person who is not domiciled in this state is \$60.

SECTION 13. Section 522.029(f), Transportation Code, as added by Chapter 1372 (H.B. 1200), Acts of the 75th Legislature, Regular Session, 1997, is amended to read as follows:

8 <u>with endorsements authorizing the driving of a passenger vehicle, a</u>
9 <u>school bus, or a tank vehicle.</u>

24 (f) [(c)] A person commits an offense if the person violates
 25 Subsection (c), (d), or (e) [(b)]. An offense under this section is
 26 a Class C misdemeanor.

27 SECTION 20. Section 522.051, Transportation Code, is

1 amended by amending Subsections (a), (b), (c), (d), and (f) and 2 adding Subsection (h) to read as follows:

3 (a) Except as provided by Subsection (f) and Sections
4 522.013(e), 522.033, and 522.054, an original commercial driver's
5 license [or commercial driver learner's permit] expires five years
6 after the applicant's next birthday.

7 (b) Except as provided by Section 522.054, a commercial 8 driver's license [or commercial driver learner's permit] issued to 9 a person holding a Texas Class A, B, C, or M license that would 10 expire one year or more after the date of issuance of the commercial 11 driver's license [or commercial driver learner's permit] expires 12 five years after the applicant's next birthday.

(c) Except as provided by Section 522.054, a commercial driver's license [or commercial driver learner's permit] issued to a person holding a Texas Class A, B, C, or M license that would expire less than one year after the date of issuance of the commercial driver's license [or commercial driver learner's permit] or that has been expired for less than one year expires five years after the expiration date shown on the Class A, B, C, or M license.

(d) Except as provided by Section 522.054, a commercial driver's license [or commercial driver learner's permit] issued to a person holding a Texas Class A, B, C, or M license that has been expired for at least one year but not more than two years expires five years after the applicant's last birthday.

(f) Except as provided by Section 522.013, a <u>non-domiciled</u> [nonresident] commercial driver's license other than a temporary <u>non-domiciled</u> [nonresident] commercial driver's license under

Section 522.013(e) expires on [the earlier of]: 1 2 (1) the earlier of: (A) the first birthday of the license holder 3 occurring after the fifth anniversary of the date of the 4 5 application; or 6 (B) the expiration date of the license holder's 7 lawful presence in the United States as determined by the appropriate United States agency in compliance with federal law 8 [the expiration date of the visa presented under Section 9 10 522.021(a-1)(2)(B)]; or (2) the first anniversary of the date of issuance, if 11 there is no definitive expiration date for the applicant's 12 13 authorized stay in the United States [expiration date of the Form I-94 Arrival/Departure record, or a successor document, presented 14 under Section 522.021(a-1)(2)(C)]. 15 16 (h) A commercial learner's permit expires on the earlier of: 17 (1) the expiration date of the driver's license or commercial driver's license; or 18 (2) the 181st day after the date of issuance. 19 20 SECTION 21. Section 522.052(e), Transportation Code, is amended to read as follows: 21 22 (e) A commercial [driver] learner's permit may [not] be renewed once for an additional 180 days without requiring the 23 applicant to retake the general and endorsement knowledge tests. 24 25 SECTION 22. Section 522.054(a), Transportation Code, is amended to read as follows: 26 27 (a) Each original commercial driver's license [<del>and</del>

1 commercial driver learner's permit] of a person 85 years of age or 2 older expires on the license holder's second birthday after the 3 date of the license application.

4 SECTION 23. Section 522.0541, Transportation Code, is 5 amended to read as follows:

6 Sec. 522.0541. DENIAL OF RENEWAL OF COMMERCIAL DRIVER 7 LICENSE OR LEARNER PERMIT. (a) In the manner ordered by a court in another state in connection with a matter involving the violation 8 9 of a state law or local ordinance relating to motor vehicle traffic control and on receipt of the necessary information from the other 10 11 state, the department may deny renewal of the commercial driver's license or commercial learner's permit issued to a person by the 12 13 department for the person's:
