A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to the creation of a commission to recommend a new system
3	for student assessment and public school accountability.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Chapter 39, Education Code, is amended by adding
6	Subchapter N to read as follows:
7	SUBCHAPTER N. TEXAS COMMISSION ON NEXT GENERATION ASSESSMENTS AND
8	ACCOUNTABILITY
9	Sec. 39.501. DEFINITION. In this subchapter, "commission"
10	means the Texas Commission on Next Generation Assessments and
11	Accountability.
12	Sec. 39.502. TEXAS COMMISSION ON NEXT GENERATION
13	ASSESSMENTS AND ACCOUNTABILITY. (a) The Texas Commission on Next
14	Generation Assessments and Accountability is established to
15	develop and make recommendations for new systems of student
16	assessment and public school accountability.
17	(b) The commission is composed of 15 members, consisting of
18	the following:
19	(1) four members appointed by the governor;
20	(2) three members appointed by the lieutenant
21	governor;
22	(3) three members appointed by the speaker of the
23	house of representatives;
24	(4) the chair of the senate committee on education, or

No. 1200 a representative designated by the chair; 1 2 (5) the chair of the senate committee on higher 3 education, or a representative designated by the chair; (6) the chair of the house of representatives 4 committee on public education, or a representative designated by 5 6 the chair; 7 (7) the chair of the house of representatives committee on higher education, or a representative designated by 8 9 the chair; and 10 (8) a member of the State Board of Education, as 11 designated by the chair of that board. (c) In making appointments under Subsections (b)(1), (2), 12 13 and (3), the governor, lieutenant governor, and speaker of the house of representatives shall coordinate to ensure that the 14 commission includes at least one of each of the following 15 16 representatives: (1) a parent or person standing in parental relation 17 to a student enrolled in the public school system; 18 (2) an educator in the public school system; 19 20 (3) an educator in a school district that is a 21 participant in the Texas High Performance Schools Consortium under Section 7.0561; 22 23 (4) a member of the business community; 24 (5) a member of the civic community; 25 (6) a leader in student assessment development and 26 use; and 27 (7) a leader in research concerning student assessment

13	deliver a report to the governor and the legislature that
14	recommends statutory changes to improve systems of student
15	assessment and public school accountability not later than
16	September 1, 2016.
17	(b) In preparing the report, the commission shall consider
18	the recommendations of the Texas High Performance Schools
19	Consortium established under Section 7.0561, including
20	recommendations related to innovative, next-generation learning
21	standards and assessment and accountability systems.
22	Sec. 39.508. PUBLIC MEETINGS AND PUBLIC INFORMATION.
23	(a) The commission may hold public meetings as needed to fulfill
24	its duties under this subchapter.
25	(b) The commission is subject to Chapters 551 and 552,
26	Government Code.
27	Sec. 39.509. COMMISSION ABOLISHED; EXPIRATION OF

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SUBCHAPTER. (a)The commission is abolished January 1, 2017.(b)This subchapter expires January 1, 2017.

3 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 4 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 5 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 6 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 7 Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
