## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

	AN ACT

- 2 relating to the Texas Military Preparedness Commission and
- 3 strategic planning regarding military bases and defense
- 4 installations.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Section 436.002, Government Code, is amended to
- 7 read as follows:
- 8 Sec. 436.002. COMMISSION. The commission is <u>attached for</u>
- 9 <u>administrative purposes to</u> [within] the office of the governor [and
- 10 shall report to the executive director of the office].
- SECTION 2. Section 436.0561(b), Government Code, is amended
- 12 to read as follows:
- 13 (b) The training program must provide the person with
- 14 information regarding:
- 15 (1) the legislation that created the commission;
- 16 (2) the programs, functions, rules, and budget of the
- 17 commission;
- 18 (3) the results of the most recent formal audit of the
- 19 commission;
- 20 (4) the requirements of laws relating to open
- 21 meetings, public information, administrative procedure, and
- 22 conflicts of interest; and
- 23 (5) any applicable ethics policies adopted by [the
- 24 office, the commission[ $_{\tau}$ ] or the Texas Ethics Commission.

- 1 SECTION 3. Section 436.057(c), Government Code, is amended
- 2 to read as follows:
- 3 (c) The <u>director may hire</u> [<del>governor shall determine the</del>]
- 4 staff within the guidelines established by [for] the commission.
- 5 SECTION 4. The heading to Section 436.105, Government Code,
- 6 is amended to read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 436.105. MILITARY BASE REALIGNMENT AND CLOSURE TASK
- 8 FORCE; EXPIRATION DATE.
- 9 SECTION 5. Section 436.105, Government Code, is amended by
- 10 adding Subsections (b-1) and (d) to read as follows:
- 11 (b-1) A member of the task force is entitled to
- 12 <u>reimbursement for travel expenses.</u>
- 13 <u>(d) The task force is abolished and this section expires</u>
- 14 September 1, 2019.
- SECTION 6. Section 436.152(d), Government Code, is amended
- 16 to read as follows:
- 17 (d) The commission shall refer the defense community to the
- 18 appropriate state agency that has an existing program to provide
- 19 financing for each project identified in the community's military
- 20 base or defense facility value enhancement statement that adds
- 21 military or defense value to a military base or defense facility.
- 22 If there is no existing program to finance a project, the commission
- 23 [office] may provide a loan of financial assistance to the defense
- 24 community for the project.
- 25 SECTION 7. Sections 436.153(a) through (g), Government
- 26 Code, are amended to read as follows:
- 27 (a) The commission [office] may provide a loan of financial

- 1 assistance to a defense community for a project that will enhance
- 2 the military or defense value of a military base or defense facility
- 3 located in, near, or adjacent to the defense community. The loan
- 4 shall be made from the Texas military value revolving loan account
- 5 established under Section 436.156.
- 6 (b) On receiving an application for a loan under this
- 7 section, the commission [office] shall confirm [with the
- 8 commission] that the project adds military or defense value to the
- 9 military base or defense facility.
- 10 (c) If the commission determines that a project will enhance
- 11 the military or defense value of the military base or defense
- 12 facility, the commission [office] shall, in accordance with the
- 13 criteria adopted by the commission [office] under Section
- 14 436.154(a):
- 15 (1) analyze the creditworthiness of the defense
- 16 community to determine the defense community's ability to repay the
- 17 loan; and
- 18 (2) evaluate the feasibility of the project to be
- 19 financed to ensure that the defense community has pledged a source
- 20 of revenue or taxes sufficient to repay the loan for the project.
- 21 (d) If the commission confirms that the funds will be used
- 22 to enhance the military or defense value of the military base or
- 23 defense facility based on the base realignment and closure
- 24 criteria, to overcome an action of the United States Department of
- 25 Defense that will negatively impact the military base or defense
- 26 facility, or for the recruitment or retention of a defense facility
- 27 and the commission [office] determines that the project is

- 1 financially feasible, the <a href="commission">commission</a> [executive director of the
- 2 office] may award a loan to the defense community for the project.
- 3 The commission [office] shall enter into a written agreement with a
- 4 defense community that is awarded a loan. The agreement must
- 5 contain the terms and conditions of the loan, including the loan
- 6 repayment requirements.
- 7 (e) The <u>commission</u> [office] shall notify the Texas Public
- 8 Finance Authority of the amount of the loan and the recipient of the
- 9 loan and request the authority to issue general obligation bonds in
- 10 an amount necessary to fund the loan. The <u>commission</u> [office] and
- 11 the authority shall determine the amount and time of a bond issue to
- 12 best provide funds for one or multiple loans.
- 13 (f) The commission [office] shall administer the loans to
- 14 ensure full repayment of the general obligation bonds issued to
- 15 finance the project.
- 16 (g) The commission [office] may provide a loan only for a
- 17 project that is included in the political subdivision's statement
- 18 under Section 397.002, Local Government Code, or to prepare a
- 19 comprehensive defense [installation and] community strategic
- 20 impact plan under Section 397.003, Local Government Code.
- 21 SECTION 8. Sections 436.1531(a), (c), (d), (e), and (f),
- 22 Government Code, are amended to read as follows:
- 23 (a) The commission [office] may provide a loan of financial
- 24 assistance to a defense community for an economic development
- 25 project that minimizes the negative effects of a defense base
- 26 reduction on the defense community as a result of a United States
- 27 Department of Defense base realignment process that occurs during

- 1 2005 or later. The loan shall be made from the Texas military value
- 2 revolving loan account established under Section 436.156.
- 3 (c) If the commission determines that a project will reduce
- 4 the negative effects of a defense base reduction on the defense
- 5 community, the commission [office] shall:
- 6 (1) analyze the creditworthiness of the defense
- 7 community to determine the defense community's ability to repay the
- 8 loan; and
- 9 (2) evaluate the feasibility of the project to be
- 10 financed to ensure that the defense community has pledged a source
- 11 of revenue or taxes sufficient to repay the loan for the project.
- 12 (d) If the commission [office] determines that the funds
- 13 will be used to finance an economic development project that will
- 14 reduce the negative effects of a defense base reduction on the
- 15 defense community and that the project is financially feasible, the
- 16 <u>commission</u> [office] may award a loan to the defense community for
- 17 the project. The commission [office] shall enter into a written
- 18 agreement with a defense community that is awarded a loan. The
- 19 agreement must contain the terms and conditions of the loan,
- 20 including the loan repayment requirements.
- 21 (e) The <u>commission</u> [office] shall notify the Texas Public
- 22 Finance Authority of the amount of the loan and the recipient of the
- 23 loan and request the authority to issue general obligation bonds in
- 24 an amount necessary to fund the loan. The <a href="commission">commission</a> [office] and
- 25 the authority shall determine the amount and time of a bond issue to
- 26 best provide funds for one or multiple loans.
- 27 (f) The commission [office] shall administer the loans to

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- 1 ensure full repayment of the general obligation bonds issued to
- 2 finance the project.
- 3 SECTION 9. Sections 436.1532(a), (c), (d), (e), and (f),
- 4 Government Code, are amended to read as follows:
- 5 (a) The commission [office] may provide a loan of financial
- 6 assistance to a defense community for an infrastructure project to
- 7 accommodate new or expanded military missions assigned to a
- 8 military base or defense facility located in, near, or adjacent to
- 9 the defense community as a result of a United States Department of
- 10 Defense base realignment process that occurs during 2005 or later.
- 11 The loan shall be made from the Texas military value revolving loan
- 12 account established under Section 436.156.
- 13 (c) If the commission determines that the project will
- 14 assist the defense community in accommodating the new or expanded
- 15 military missions that are assigned to the military facility, the
- 16 <u>commission</u> [office] shall:
- 17 (1) analyze the creditworthiness of the defense
- 18 community to determine the defense community's ability to repay the
- 19 loan; and
- 20 (2) evaluate the feasibility of the project to be
- 21 financed to ensure that the defense community has pledged a source
- 22 of revenue or taxes sufficient to repay the loan for the project.
- 23 (d) If the commission determines that the funds will be used
- 24 to finance an infrastructure project to accommodate new or expanded
- 25 military missions assigned to the military facility located in,
- 26 near, or adjacent to the defense community and the commission
- 27 [office] determines that the project is financially feasible, the

- 1 <u>commission</u> [<del>office</del>] may award a loan to the defense community for
- 2 the project. The commission [office] shall enter into a written
- 3 agreement with a defense community that is awarded a loan. The
- 4 agreement must contain the terms and conditions of the loan,
- 5 including the loan repayment requirements.
- 6 (e) The <u>commission</u> [office] shall notify the Texas Public
- 7 Finance Authority of the amount of the loan and the recipient of the
- 8 loan and request the authority to issue general obligation bonds in
- 9 an amount necessary to fund the loan. The commission [office] and
- 10 the authority shall determine the amount and time of a bond issue to
- 11 best provide funds for one or multiple loans.
- 12 (f) The commission [office] shall administer the loans to
- 13 ensure full repayment of the general obligation bonds issued to
- 14 finance the project.
- 15 SECTION 10. Section 436.154, Government Code, is amended to
- 16 read as follows:
- Sec. 436.154. LOAN PROCESS. (a) The commission [office]
- 18 shall adopt rules, in consultation with the Texas Public Finance
- 19 Authority, that contain the criteria for evaluating the credit of a
- 20 loan applicant and the financial feasibility of a project. The
- 21 <u>commission</u> [office] shall also adopt a loan application form. The
- 22 application form may include:
- 23 (1) the name of the defense community and its
- 24 principal officers;
- 25 (2) the total cost of the project;
- 26 (3) the amount of state financial assistance
- 27 requested;

- 1 (4) the plan for repaying the loan; and
- 2 (5) any other information the <u>commission</u> [office]
- 3 requires to perform its duties and to protect the public interest.
- 4 (b) The commission [office] may not accept an application
- 5 for a loan from the Texas military value revolving loan account
- 6 unless the application is submitted in affidavit form by the
- 7 officials of the defense community. The <a href="commission">commission</a> [office] shall
- 8 prescribe the affidavit form.
- 9 SECTION 11. Section 436.156(c), Government Code, is amended
- 10 to read as follows:
- 11 (c) The commission [office] shall deposit to the credit of
- 12 the account all loan payments made by a political subdivision for a
- 13 loan under Section 436.153, 436.1531, or 436.1532. The loan
- 14 payments shall be used to reimburse the general revenue fund for
- 15 money appropriated to pay the principal, premium if any, and
- 16 interest on the bonds issued under Section 436.158. If loan
- 17 payments exceed the amounts required for reimbursement, the excess
- 18 shall first be applied to reimburse the expenses of administering
- 19 the program and secondly deposited to the credit of the Texas
- 20 military value revolving loan account to fund subsequent loans.
- 21 SECTION 12. Section 436.202, Government Code, is amended by
- 22 amending Subsections (a), (b), and (c) and adding Subsection (e) to
- 23 read as follows:
- 24 (a) From money appropriated for this purpose, the
- 25 commission may make a grant to an eligible local governmental
- 26 entity to:
- 27 (1) enable the entity to match money or meet an

- 1 investment requirement necessary to receive federal assistance
- 2 provided to the local governmental entity for responding to or
- 3 recovering from an event described by Section 436.201(b);
- 4 (2) match the entity's contribution for a purpose
- 5 described by Section 436.203 at a closed or realigned defense
- 6 facility; [<del>or</del>]
- 7 (3) construct infrastructure and other projects
- 8 necessary to accommodate a new or expanded military mission at a
- 9 military base or to reduce the impact of an action of the United
- 10 States Department of Defense that will negatively impact a defense
- 11 facility located in or near the entity; or
- 12 (4) construct affordable single family, multifamily,
- 13 and veteran's supportive housing financed under the low income
- 14 housing tax credit program under Subchapter DD, Chapter 2306.
- 15 (b) The commission may not make a grant for an amount less
- 16 than \$50,000 or an amount more than the lesser of:
- 17 (1) 50 percent of the amount of matching money or
- 18 investment that the local governmental entity is required to
- 19 provide, subject to Subsection (c);
- 20 (2) 50 percent of the local governmental entity's
- 21 investment for purposes described by Section 436.203 if federal
- 22 assistance is unavailable; or
- 23 (3)  $\frac{\$5}{\$}$  [ $\frac{\$2}{\$}$ ] million.
- (c) If the local governmental entity demonstrates to the
- 25 commission that, because of a limited budget, the entity lacks the
- 26 resources necessary to provide 50 percent of the amount of matching
- 27 money or investment that the entity is required to provide, the

- 1 commission may make a grant in an amount of not more than 80 percent
- 2 of the amount of that matching money or investment requirement but
- 3 may not make a grant in an amount that exceeds \$5 [\$2] million.
- 4 (e) The commission may make a grant to an eligible local
- 5 governmental entity for a project described by Subsection (a)(4) in
- 6 <u>an amount that does not exceed the lesser of 10 percent of the total</u>
- 7 construction cost of the project or \$5 million.
- 8 SECTION 13. Section 436.204(b), Government Code, is amended
- 9 to read as follows:
- 10 (b) The <u>commission</u> [office] may assist a local governmental
- 11 entity in applying for a grant under this chapter.
- 12 SECTION 14. Section 481.502(a), Government Code, is amended
- 13 to read as follows:
- 14 (a) The office and the Texas Military Preparedness
- 15 <u>Commission</u> shall assist defense communities in obtaining financing
- 16 for economic development projects that seek to address future
- 17 realignment or closure of a defense base that is in, adjacent to, or
- 18 near the defense community. The office shall refer the defense
- 19 community to:
- 20 (1) a local economic development corporation created
- 21 under the Development Corporation Act (Subtitle C1, Title 12, Local
- 22 Government Code) for possible financing; or
- 23 (2) an appropriate state agency that has an existing
- 24 program to provide financing for the project, including:
- 25 (A) the Texas Water Development Board; or
- 26 (B) the Texas Department of Transportation.
- SECTION 15. Section 436.001(5), Government Code, is

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- 1 repealed.
- 2 SECTION 16. A rule, policy, procedure, or decision of the
- 3 Texas Economic Development and Tourism Office with respect to
- 4 functions that are transferred under this Act to the Texas Military
- 5 Preparedness Commission continues in effect as a rule, policy,
- 6 procedure, or decision of the Texas Military Preparedness
- 7 Commission until superseded by an act of that commission.
- 8 SECTION 17. This Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
