4	SECTION 1. Section 28.002, Education Code, is amended by
5	amending Subsection (a) and adding Subsections (x) , (y) , and (z) to

7	(a) Each school district that offers kindergarten through
8	grade 12 shall offer, as a required curriculum:
9	(1) a foundation curriculum that includes:
10	(A) English language arts;

13	(D) social studies, consisting of Texas, United
14	States, and world history, government, economics, with emphasis on
15	the free enterprise system and its benefits, [and] geography, and
16	constitutional law, with emphasis on case law; and
17	(2) an enrichment curriculum that includes:
18	(A) to the extent possible, languages other than
19	English;
20	(B) health, with emphasis on the importance of
21	proper nutrition and exercise;
22	(C) physical education;
23	(D) fine arts;
24	(E) career and technology education;

1 technology applications; (F) 2 (G) religious literature, including the Hebrew Scriptures (Old Testament) and New Testament, and its impact on 3 4 history and literature; [and] 5 personal financial literacy; 6 (I) capitalism, including entrepreneurship and 7 free market principles; and (J) Western civilization, including ethics. 8 9 (x) In adopting the essential knowledge and skills for the social studies curriculum under Subsection (a)(1)(D), the State 10 Board of Education shall adopt essential knowledge and skills that 11 encourage character building, including developing and improving 12 13 the positive character traits listed in Section 29.906(b). (y) In adopting the essential knowledge and skills for the 14 capitalism curriculum under Subsection (a)(2)(I), the State Board 15 16 of Education shall consult with entrepreneurs and other experts on capitalism and free market principles. 17 18 (z) In adopting the essential knowledge and skills for the Western civilization curriculum under Subsection (a)(2)(J), the 19 20 State Board of Education shall: 21 (1) adopt essential knowledge and skills that 22 encourage character building, including developing and improving the positive character traits listed in Section 29.906(b); and 23 (2) consult with experts on Western civilization, 24

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SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
