3	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
4	SECTION 1. Title 2, Occupations Code, is amended by adding
5	Chapter 60 to read as follows:
6	CHAPTER 60. ENFORCEMENT OF OCCUPATIONAL REGULATIONS
7	Sec. 60.001. DEFINITIONS. In this chapter:
8	(1) "License" means a license, certificate,
9	registration, permit, or other form of authorization required by
10	law or a state agency rule that must be obtained by an individual to
11	engage in a particular occupation.
12	(2) "State agency" means a department, board, bureau,
13	commission, committee, division, office, council, or agency of the
14	state.
15	Sec. 60.002. POLICY REGARDING REGULATION OF OCCUPATIONS;
16	CONSTRUCTION. (a) It is the policy of this state that:
17	(1) an individual in this state has the right to engage
18	in any lawful occupation without excessive governmental
19	regulation; and
20	(2) a lawful occupation may be regulated by the state
21	only if the regulation is:
22	(A) necessary to further an important interest of
23	the state in protecting against a recognizable harm to the health or
24	safety of the public; and

- 1 (B) the least restrictive means necessary to
- 2 further the interest described by Paragraph (A).
- 3 (b) In any action under this chapter, a court or
- 4 administrative law judge shall liberally construe this chapter in
- 5 order to give effect to the policy under Subsection (a).
- 6 Sec. 60.003. APPLICATION OF CHAPTER. This chapter applies
- 7 to any regulation of a lawful occupation unless the statute
- 8 providing for the regulation expressly states that the regulation
- 9 is not subject to this chapter.
- 10 Sec. 60.004. DEFENSE AVAILABLE. In any enforcement action
- 11 by a state agency against an individual for failure to comply with
- 12 an occupational regulation, including a requirement to obtain a
- 13 license to engage in a lawful occupation, the individual may
- 14 present evidence that the regulation substantially burdens the
- 15 individual's right to engage in a lawful occupation. The state
- 16 agency has the burden of establishing by clear and convincing
- 17 evidence that the occupational regulation that the agency seeks to
- 18 enforce is:
- 19 (1) necessary to further an important interest of the
- 20 state in protecting against a recognizable harm to the health or
- 21 safety of the public; and
- 22 (2) the least restrictive means necessary to further
- 23 the interest described by Subdivision (1).
- Sec. 60.005. DECLARATORY JUDGMENT. (a) An individual may
- 25 file suit against the state for declaratory judgment that a
- 26 regulatory requirement imposed on an occupation violates Section
- 27 60.002(a).

- 2 <u>district court in Travis County.</u>
- 3 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
