## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

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- 2 relating to the protection of certain children through the
- 3 operation of the child safety check alert list.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 261.3022, Family Code, is amended to
- 6 read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 261.3022. CHILD SAFETY CHECK ALERT LIST. (a) Subject
- 8 to the availability of funds, the Department of Public Safety of the
- 9 State of Texas shall create a child safety check alert list as part
- 10 of the Texas Crime Information Center to help locate a child or the
- 11 child's family for purposes of:
- 12 (1) investigating a report of child abuse or neglect;
- 13 (2) providing protective services to a family
- 14 receiving family-based support services; or
- 15 (3) providing protective services to the family of a
- 16 child in the managing conservatorship of the department.
- 17 (b) If the child safety check alert list is established and
- 18 the department is unable to locate a child or the child's family for
- 19 <u>a purpose stated in Subsection (a)</u> [purposes of investigating a
- 20 report of child abuse or neglect], after the department has
- 21 exhausted all means available to the department for locating the
- 22 child or the child's family, the department may seek assistance
- 23 under this section from the appropriate [county attorney, district
- 24 attorney, or criminal district] attorney with responsibility for

- 1 representing the department as provided by Section 264.009.
- 2 (c) If the department requests assistance, the [county]
- 3 attorney with responsibility for representing the department  $[\tau]$
- 4 district attorney, or criminal district attorney, as applicable,
- 5 may file an application with the court requesting the issuance of an
- 6 ex parte order requiring the Texas Crime Information Center to
- 7 place the child or the members of the child's family whom the
- 8 department is attempting to locate on a child safety check alert
- 9 list. The application must include a summary of:
- 10 (1) either:
- 11 <u>(A)</u> the report of child abuse or neglect the
- 12 department is attempting to investigate; or
- 13 <u>(B) the circumstances in a case described by</u>
- 14 Subsection (a)(2) or (3) that cause a child to be at a substantial
- 15 risk of harm because the family cannot be located; and
- 16 (2) the department's efforts to locate the <u>missing</u>
- 17 child or the child's family.
- 18 (d) If the court determines after a hearing that the family
- 19 cannot be located to investigate a report of child abuse or neglect,
- 20 that a child is at a substantial risk of harm because the family
- 21 <u>cannot be located, and that</u> the department has exhausted all means
- 22 available to the department for locating the child or the child's
- 23 family, as applicable, the court shall approve the application and
- 24 order the appropriate law enforcement agency to notify the Texas
- 25 Crime Information Center to place the child or the child's family,
- 26 <u>as applicable</u>, on a child safety check alert list. The alert list
- 27 must include:

- 1 (1) if applicable, the name of the family member
- 2 alleged to have abused or neglected a child according to the report
- 3 the department is attempting to investigate;
- 4 (2) the name of any parent, managing conservator, or
- 5 guardian of the child who cannot be located for the purposes
- 6 described by Subsection (a);
- 7 (3) the name of the child who is the subject of the
- 8 report or is receiving services described by Subsection (a)(2) or
- 9 (3);
- 10 (4) if applicable,  $\left[\frac{(3)}{(3)}\right]$  a code identifying the type
- 11 of child abuse or neglect alleged or determined to have been
- 12 committed against the child;
- 13 (5)  $\left[\frac{4}{4}\right]$  the family's last known address; and
- (6)  $[\frac{(5)}{(5)}]$  the minimum criteria for an entry as
- 15 established by the center.
- SECTION 2. Section 261.3023(a), Family Code, is amended to
- 17 read as follows:
- 18 (a) If a law enforcement officer encounters a person,
- 19 including a child, listed on the Texas Crime Information Center's
- 20 child safety check alert list [who is alleged to have abused or
- 21 neglected a child, or encounters a child listed on the alert list
- 22 who is the subject of a report of child abuse or neglect the
- 23 department is attempting to investigate], the officer shall request
- 24 information from the person or the child regarding the child's
- 25 well-being and current residence.
- SECTION 3. Section 261.3024(a), Family Code, is amended to
- 27 read as follows:

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- 1 (a) A law enforcement officer who locates a child listed on
  2 the Texas Crime Information Center's child safety check alert list
  3 [who is the subject of a report of child abuse or neglect the
  4 department is attempting to investigate] and who reports the
  5 child's current address and other relevant information to the
  6 department under Section 261.3023 shall report to the Texas Crime
  7 Information Center that the child has been located.
- 8 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
