A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

2 relating to physical activity and physical education requirements

- 3 in public schools.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 28.002(1), Education Code, is amended to
- 6 read as follows:
- 7 (1) A school district shall require a student enrolled in
- 8 full-day prekindergarten, in kindergarten, or in a grade level
- 9 below grade six to participate in moderate or vigorous daily
- 10 physical activity for at least 30 minutes throughout the school
- 11 year as part of the district's physical education curriculum or
- 12 through structured activity during a school campus's daily
- 13 recess. To the extent practicable, a school district shall require
- 14 a student enrolled in prekindergarten on less than a full-day basis
- 15 to participate in the same type and amount of physical activity as a
- 16 student enrolled in full-day prekindergarten. A school district
- 17 shall require students enrolled in grade levels six, seven, and
- 18 eight to participate in moderate or vigorous daily physical
- 19 activity for at least 30 minutes for \underline{six} [at least four] semesters
- 20 during those grade levels as part of the district's physical
- 21 education curriculum. If a school district determines, for any
- 22 particular grade level below grade six, that requiring moderate or
- 23 vigorous daily physical activity is impractical due to scheduling
- 24 concerns or other factors, the district may as an alternative

- 1 require a student in that grade level to participate in moderate or
- 2 vigorous physical activity for at least 135 minutes during each
- 3 school week. Additionally, a school district may as an alternative
- 4 require a student enrolled in a grade level for which the district
- 5 uses block scheduling to participate in moderate or vigorous
- 6 physical activity for at least 225 minutes during each period of two
- 7 school weeks. A school district must provide for an exemption for:
- 8 (1) any student who is unable to participate in the
- 9 required physical activity because of illness or disability; and
- 10 (2) a middle school or junior high school student who
- 11 participates in an extracurricular activity with a moderate or
- 12 vigorous physical activity component that is considered a
- 13 structured activity under rules adopted by the commissioner.
- SECTION 2. Section 28.025(b-1), Education Code, is amended
- 15 to read as follows:
- 16 (b-1) The State Board of Education by rule shall require
- 17 that the curriculum requirements for the foundation high school
- 18 program under Subsection (a) include a requirement that students
- 19 successfully complete:
- 20 (1) four credits in English language arts under
- 21 Section 28.002(a)(1)(A), including one credit in English I, one
- 22 credit in English II, one credit in English III, and one credit in
- 23 an advanced English course authorized under Subsection (b-2);
- 24 (2) three credits in mathematics under Section
- 25 28.002(a)(1)(B), including one credit in Algebra I, one credit in
- 26 geometry, and one credit in any advanced mathematics course
- 27 authorized under Subsection (b-2);

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- 1 (3) three credits in science under Section
- 2 28.002(a)(1)(C), including one credit in biology, one credit in any
- 3 advanced science course authorized under Subsection (b-2), and one
- 4 credit in integrated physics and chemistry or in an additional
- 5 advanced science course authorized under Subsection (b-2);
- 6 (4) three credits in social studies under Section
- 7 28.002(a)(1)(D), including one credit in United States history, at
- 8 least one-half credit in government and at least one-half credit in
- 9 economics, and one credit in world geography or world history;
- 10 (5) except as provided under Subsections (b-12),
- 11 (b-13), and (b-14), two credits in the same language in a language
- 12 other than English under Section 28.002(a)(2)(A);
- 13 (6) 4-1/2 [five] elective credits;
- 14 (7) one credit in fine arts under Section
- 15 28.002(a)(2)(D); and
- 16 (8) except as provided by Subsection (b-11), 1-1/2
- 17 credits [one credit] in physical education under Section
- 18 28.002(a)(2)(C).
- 19 SECTION 3. Section 28.002(1), Education Code, as amended by
- 20 this Act, applies only to students entering the sixth grade during
- 21 the 2015-2016 school year or a later school year. For students
- 22 entering a grade above sixth grade during the 2015-2016 school
- 23 year, Section 28.002(1), Education Code, as that section existed
- 24 before amendment by this Act, applies, and that section is
- 25 continued in effect for that purpose.
- SECTION 4. Section 28.025(b-1), Education Code, as amended
- 27 by this Act, applies only to students entering the ninth grade

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- 1 during the 2015-2016 school year or a later school year. For
- 2 students entering a grade above ninth grade during the 2015-2016
- 3 school year, Section 28.025(b-1), Education Code, as that section
- 4 existed before amendment by this Act, applies, and that section is
- 5 continued in effect for that purpose.
- 6 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 7 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 8 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 9 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 10 Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
