A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to alternative education programs for middle school
- 3 students.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 29.081, Education Code, is amended by
- 6 amending Subsection (d) and adding Subsection (e-1) to read as
- 7 follows:
- 8 (d) For purposes of this section, "student at risk of
- 9 dropping out of school" includes each student who is under 26 years
- 10 of age and who:
- 11 (1) was not advanced from one grade level to the next
- 12 for one or more school years;
- 13 (2) if the student is in grade <u>6</u>, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11, or
- 14 12, did not maintain an average equivalent to 70 on a scale of 100 in
- 15 two or more subjects in the foundation curriculum during a semester
- 16 in the preceding or current school year or is not maintaining such
- 17 an average in two or more subjects in the foundation curriculum in
- 18 the current semester;
- 19 (3) did not perform satisfactorily on an assessment
- 20 instrument administered to the student under Subchapter B, Chapter
- 21 39, and who has not in the previous or current school year
- 22 subsequently performed on that instrument or another appropriate
- 23 instrument at a level equal to at least 110 percent of the level of
- 24 satisfactory performance on that instrument;

- 1 (4) if the student is in prekindergarten,
- 2 kindergarten, or grade 1, 2, or 3, did not perform satisfactorily on
- 3 a readiness test or assessment instrument administered during the
- 4 current school year;
- 5 (5) is pregnant or is a parent;
- 6 (6) has been placed in an alternative education
- 7 program in accordance with Section 37.006 during the preceding or
- 8 current school year;
- 9 (7) has been expelled in accordance with Section
- 10 37.007 during the preceding or current school year;
- 11 (8) is currently on parole, probation, deferred
- 12 prosecution, or other conditional release;
- 13 (9) was previously reported through the Public
- 14 Education Information Management System (PEIMS) to have dropped out
- 15 of school;
- 16 (10) is a student of limited English proficiency, as
- 17 defined by Section 29.052;
- 18 (11) is in the custody or care of the Department of
- 19 Protective and Regulatory Services or has, during the current
- 20 school year, been referred to the department by a school official,
- 21 officer of the juvenile court, or law enforcement official;
- 22 (12) is homeless, as defined by 42 U.S.C. Section
- 23 11302, and its subsequent amendments; or
- 24 (13) resided in the preceding school year or resides
- 25 in the current school year in a residential placement facility in
- 26 the district, including a detention facility, substance abuse
- 27 treatment facility, emergency shelter, psychiatric hospital,

- 1 halfway house, or foster group home.
- 2 (e-1) Each school district may provide alternative
- 3 education programs for students at risk of dropping out of school
- 4 who are in grade 6, 7, or 8. The district may partner with a private
- 5 or public community-based organization to assist in providing
- 6 expanded learning opportunities for students at risk of dropping
- 7 out. A program under this subsection must educate students about
- 8 each endorsement described by Section 28.025(c-1) and
- 9 postsecondary education and career opportunities by:
- 10 (1) including experiential, project-based learning
- 11 <u>activities related to the endorsements; and</u>
- 12 (2) incorporating volunteer business and industry
- 13 mentors from the local community.
- 14 SECTION 2. This Act applies beginning with the 2015-2016
- 15 school year.
- SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 17 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 18 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 19 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 20 Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
