## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Section 51.9241, Education Code, is amended by
- 7 amending Subsection (b) and adding Subsection (d) to read as
- 8 follows:
- 9 (b) Because the State of Texas considers successful
- 10 completion of a nontraditional secondary education to be equivalent
- 11 to graduation from a public high school, an institution of higher
- 12 education must treat an applicant for admission to the institution
- 13 as an undergraduate student who presents evidence that the person
- 14 has successfully completed a nontraditional secondary education
- 15 according to the same general standards, including specific
- 16 standardized testing score requirements, as other applicants for
- 17 undergraduate admission who have graduated from a public high
- 18 school.
- 19 (d) If an institution of higher education in its
- 20 undergraduate admission review process sorts applicants by high
- 21 school graduating class rank, the institution shall place any
- 22 applicant who presents evidence that the applicant has successfully
- 23 completed a nontraditional secondary education that does not
- 24 include a high school graduating class ranking at the average high

- 1 school graduating class rank of undergraduate applicants to the
- 2 <u>institution</u> who have equivalent standardized testing scores as the
- 3 applicant.
- 4 SECTION 2. The changes in law made by this Act apply
- 5 beginning with admissions to a public institution of higher
- 6 education for the 2016 fall semester. Admissions to a public
- 7 institution of higher education for a term or semester before the
- 8 2016 fall semester are governed by the law in effect immediately
- 9 before the effective date of this Act, and the former law is
- 10 continued in effect for that purpose.
- 11 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
