1	AN ACT
2	relating to the establishment of an advisory committee to develop a
3	process for the collection of information necessary to facilitate
4	physician credentialing by Medicaid managed care organizations.
5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
6	SECTION 1. Subchapter B, Chapter 531, Government Code, is
7	amended by adding Section 531.0975 to read as follows:
8	Sec. 531.0975. ADVISORY COMMITTEE ON PHYSICIAN
9	CREDENTIALING BY MEDICAID MANAGED CARE ORGANIZATIONS. (a) The
10	executive commissioner shall establish an advisory committee to
11	assist the commission in developing and maintaining a process for
12	the collection of information from physicians to facilitate the
13	performance of the credentialing and recredentialing processes by
14	Medicaid managed care organizations.
15	(b) The advisory committee shall be composed of nine members
16	appointed by the executive commissioner as follows:
17	(1) four members who are physicians;
18	(2) four members who are representatives of managed
19	care organizations; and
20	(3) one member who is a representative of the
21	commission.
22	(c) In order to be eligible for appointment to the advisory
23	committee under Subsection (b), a person must be knowledgeable
24	about national standards relating to the credentialing process for

- 2 <u>(d) The executive commissioner shall designate one advisory</u>
- 3 <u>committee member to serve as presiding officer.</u>
- 4 (e) The advisory committee shall develop and the executive
- 5 commissioner shall adopt rules for the establishment of a process
- 6 through which the commission collects from a physician seeking to
- 7 be included in or remain in the provider network of a Medicaid
- 8 managed care organization all of the necessary information for the
- 9 organization to perform a sufficient credentialing or
- 10 recredentialing process to determine if the physician is qualified
- 11 to be included in or remain in the organization's provider network.
- 12 The rules must include the content and format of the form that a
- 13 physician must use to submit information to the commission for
- 14 purposes of the credentialing or recredentialing process.
- 15 <u>(f) The advisory committee shall meet at least once each</u>
- 16 <u>calendar year at the call of the presiding officer to review the</u>
- 17 <u>information that the commission collects and to determine if that</u>
- 18 information is sufficient to enable a Medicaid managed care
- 19 organization to perform credentialing and recredentialing
- 20 processes for physicians that comply with federal and state law and
- 21 standards developed by relevant national accreditation
- 22 <u>organizations. The advisory committee shall submit to the executive</u>
- 23 commissioner recommendations for any necessary changes to
- 24 commission rules as a result of this review.
- 25 (g) Nothing in this section shall be construed to:
- 26 (1) prohibit a Medicaid managed care organization from
- 27 requesting additional information from a physician for the purposes

- 1 of the credentialing or recredentialing process; or
- 2 (2) require a Medicaid managed care organization to
- 3 include in the organization's provider network a physician who
- 4 submits information to the commission as part of the process
- 5 established under this section.
- 6 (h) The advisory committee members shall serve staggered
- 7 three-year terms.
- 8 <u>(i) An advisory committee member who no longer meets the</u>
- 9 qualifications for service on the advisory committee must resign
- 10 from the advisory committee.
- 11 (j) The executive commissioner shall fill a vacancy on the
- 12 advisory committee in the same manner as other appointments to the
- 13 advisory committee.
- 14 (k) An advisory committee member may not receive
- 15 compensation for serving on the advisory committee and may not be
- 16 reimbursed for expenses incurred while conducting the business of
- 17 the advisory committee.
- 18 (1) The commission shall provide administrative support to
- 19 the advisory committee.
- 20 (m) Chapter 2110 does not apply to the advisory committee.
- 21 SECTION 2. (a) Not later than October 1, 2015, the
- 22 executive commissioner of the Health and Human Services Commission
- 23 shall establish the advisory committee and appoint the advisory
- 24 committee members for terms beginning September, 1, 2015, as
- 25 required by Section 531.0975, Government Code, as added by this
- 26 Act.
- 27 (b) In making the initial appointments and notwithstanding

- 1 Section 531.0975(h), Government Code, as added by this Act, the
- 2 executive commissioner shall designate one-third of the members to
- 3 serve for terms expiring August 31, 2016, one-third of the members
- 4 to serve for terms expiring August 31, 2017, and the remaining
- 5 one-third of the members to serve for terms expiring August 31,
- 6 2018.
- 7 SECTION 3. Not later than January 1, 2016, the advisory
- 8 committee established under Section 531.0975, Government Code, as
- 9 added by this Act, shall make initial recommendations and the
- 10 executive commissioner of the Health and Human Services Commission
- 11 shall adopt or amend rules as necessary in accordance with Section
- 12 531.0975(e), Government Code, as added by this Act.
- 13 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 14 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 15 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 16 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 17 Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
