A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

- 2 relating to the applicability of certain immunity and liability
- 3 laws to open-enrollment charter schools.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 12.1056, Education Code, is amended to
- 6 read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 12.1056. IMMUNITY [FROM LIABILITY]. (a) In matters
- 8 related to operation of an open-enrollment charter school, an
- 9 open-enrollment charter school or charter holder is immune [from
- 10 $\frac{1}{1}$ to the same extent as a school district, and $\frac{1}{1}$
- 11 employees and volunteers of the open-enrollment charter school or
- 12 <u>charter holder</u> are immune [<u>from liability</u>] to the same extent as
- 13 school district employees and volunteers. A member of the
- 14 governing body of an open-enrollment charter school or of a charter
- 15 holder is immune [from liability] to the same extent as a school
- 16 district trustee.
- 17 (b) An open-enrollment charter school is a governmental
- 18 unit as defined by Section 101.001, Civil Practice and Remedies
- 19 Code, and is subject to liability only as provided by Chapter 101,
- 20 Civil Practice and Remedies Code, and only in the manner that
- 21 liability is provided by that chapter for a school district.
- (c) An open-enrollment charter school is a local government
- 23 as defined by Section 102.001, Civil Practice and Remedies Code,
- 24 and a payment on a tort claim must comply with Chapter 102, Civil

- 1 Practice and Remedies Code.
- 2 (d) An open-enrollment charter school is a local
- 3 governmental entity as defined by Section 271.151, Local Government
- 4 Code, and is subject to liability on a contract as provided by
- 5 Subchapter I, Chapter 271, Local Government Code, and only in the
- 6 manner that liability is provided by that subchapter for a school
- 7 district.
- 8 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 9 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 10 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 11 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 12 Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
