## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT relating to the hours of work and compensatory time and overtime pay 2 3 for commissioned officers of the Department of Public Safety. Δ BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: SECTION 1. The heading to Section 411.016, Government Code, 5 6 is amended to read as follows: 7 Sec. 411.016. HOURS OF WORK; COMPENSATORY TIME; OVERTIME [SUPPLEMENTAL] PAY. 8 SECTION 2. Section 411.016, Government Code, is amended by 9 amending Subsections (a), (b), (c), and (e) and adding Subsections 10 (b-1) and (f) to read as follows: 11 This section applies to an officer commissioned by the 12 (a) department who is not employed in a position that the director has 13 declared to be administrative, executive, or professional. 14 15 (b) If, during a 24-hour period [calendar week], the total number of hours worked by a commissioned officer equal more than 16 17 eight [40] hours, the excess is overtime[. For each calendar month, the overtime for each week ending during that month shall be 18 totaled. If the total overtime for the month exceeds eight hours, 19 the officer may receive, in addition to the officer's regular 20 21 monthly salary, a supplement determined as follows: 22 [(1) a commissioned officer who accumulates more than 23 eight hours but less than 16 hours of overtime in a calendar month 24 may receive five percent of the officer's regular monthly salary;

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1	[ <del>(2) a commissioned officer who accumulated 16 or more</del>
2	hours but less than 32 hours of overtime in a calendar month may
3	receive 10 percent of the officer's regular monthly salary; and
4	[(3) a commissioned officer who accumulated 32 or more
5	hours of overtime in a calendar month may receive 15 percent of the
6	officer's regular monthly salary].
7	(b-1) If, during a work week, the total number of hours
8	worked by a commissioned officer equals more than 40 hours, the
9	excess is overtime.
10	(c) [ <del>The formula prescribed by Subsection (b) is the</del>
11	exclusive method of computing state compensation for overtime
12	entitlements.] This section applies only to the computation of
13	overtime entitlements and does not apply to the method of
14	compensating a commissioned officer for working on regularly
15	scheduled state holidays.
16	(e) The department may compensate an officer commissioned
17	by the department for the overtime earned by the officer by:
18	(1) allowing or requiring the officer to take
19	compensatory leave at the rate of 1-1/2 hours of leave for each hour
20	of overtime earned; or
21	(2) paying the officer for the overtime hours earned
22	at the rate equal to $1-1/2$ times the officer's regular hourly pay
23	rate [If the funds appropriated to the department to provide
24	supplemental pay are insufficient to pay all earned overtime
25	entitlements, the director may provide for compensatory time to be
26	taken during the biennium in which the entitlements are earned].
27	(f) If a conflict exists between this section and Section
