- 7 SECTION 1. Section 106.09, Alcoholic Beverage Code, is
- 8 amended by amending Subsection (a) and adding Subsection (f) to

- 10 (a) Except as provided by [in] Subsections (b), (c), [and]
- 11 (e), and (f) [of this section], no person may employ a person under

- 1 law in effect when the offense was committed, and the former law is
- 2 continued in effect for that purpose. For purposes of this section,
- 3 an offense was committed before the effective date of this Act if
- 4 any element of the offense occurred before that date.
- 5 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 6 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 7 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 8 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 9 Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
