A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

- 1 AN ACT
- 2 relating to a study and report on the feasibility, methods, and
- 3 costs of establishing a Texas low income housing tax credit
- 4 program.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. DEFINITION. In this Act, "department" means the
- 7 Texas Department of Housing and Community Affairs.
- 8 SECTION 2. STUDY. (a) The department shall conduct a
- 9 study to evaluate the feasibility, methods, and costs of
- 10 establishing a low income housing tax credit program for the state
- 11 of Texas.
- 12 (b) In conducting the study under Subsection (a) of this
- 13 section, the department shall:
- 14 (1) evaluate and identify sources available to fund
- 15 the program described by Subsection (a) of this section;
- 16 (2) evaluate the methods other states use for such
- 17 programs and identify what methods produce the greatest number of
- 18 affordable housing units;
- 19 (3) consider varying levels of funding for such a
- 20 program and determine the number of affordable housing units these
- 21 levels of funding would provide to the market;
- 22 (4) evaluate the tax savings that would be realized by
- 23 Texas businesses through the sale or exchange of the low income
- 24 housing tax credits; and

- 1 (5) identify the state entities best positioned to
- 2 implement and administer such a program in an efficient manner.
- 3 SECTION 3. REPORT. Not later than September 1, 2016, the
- 4 department shall submit to the legislature a written report
- 5 containing the findings of the study conducted under this Act and
- 6 the department's recommendations for any legislation or other
- 7 actions necessary to implement the program described by Section 2
- 8 of this Act.
- 9 SECTION 4. The Office of Texas Comptroller of Public
- 10 Accounts shall assist the department to the extent it is necessary
- 11 to carry out the duty of Section 2(b). This assistance shall be
- 12 rendered at the request of the department.
- SECTION 5. EXPIRATION. This Act expires September 1, 2017.
- 14 SECTION 6. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Act takes effect
- 15 immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members
- 16 elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas
- 17 Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for
- 18 immediate effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
