4	SECTION 1. Subchapter B, Chapter 531, Government Code, is

6	Sec. 531.094. MAXIMIZATION OF COUNTY INDIGENT HEALTH CARE
7	FUNDING. (a) If feasible and cost-effective, the commission shall
8	apply for a modification of or amendment to the waiver under Chapter
9	537 as necessary to more efficiently leverage the use of county
10	funds to maximize the receipt of federal Medicaid matching funds to
11	provide counties in the state with additional funding to provide
12	indigent health care under Chapter 61, Health and Safety Code.
13	(b) In pursuing the waiver modification or amendment
14	required under this section, the commission shall:
15	(1) solicit broad-based input from interested
16	persons; and
17	(2) employ the use of intergovernmental transfers and

- SECTION 2. (a) The Health and Human Services Commission 20
- 21 shall conduct a study of county expenditures on uncompensated
- health care and investigate: 22
- 23 (1) the impact uncompensated health care costs have on

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- 1 (2) local and innovative methods to reduce barriers in
- 2 health care delivery and increase access to health care; and
- 3 (3) the community benefit of health care services
- 4 provided under health care funding districts established under
- 5 Chapter 288, Health and Safety Code.
- 6 (b) Not later than December 1, 2016, the executive
- 7 commissioner of the Health and Human Services Commission shall
- 8 prepare and deliver a report to the governor, lieutenant governor,
- 9 speaker of the house of representatives, and presiding officer of
- 10 each standing committee of the senate and house of representatives
- 11 having primary jurisdiction over matters relating to health and
- 12 human services. The report must contain:
- 13 (1) a summary of the study conducted under this

- 15 (2) the recommendations of the Health and Human

- 17 recommendations of any legislation that is needed to implement the
