A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to prekindergarten programs in public schools.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 4 SECTION 1. Amend Subsection 29.153(c), Education Code, to
- 5 read as follows:
- 6 (c) A prekindergarten class under this section shall be
- 7 operated on a half-day basis or on a full-day basis as provided by
- 8 section 29.1541. A district is not required to provide
- 9 transportation for a prekindergarten class, but transportation, if
- 10 provided, is included for funding purposes as part of the regular
- 11 transportation system.
- 12 SECTION 2. Amend Section 29.1532, Education Code, as
- 13 follows:
- 14 Sec 29.1532. PREKINDERGARTEN PROGRAM REQUIREMENTS. (a) A
- 15 school district's prekindergarten program shall be designed to
- 16 develop skills necessary for success in the regular public school
- 17 curriculum, including language, mathematics, and social skills.
- 18 (b) The commissioner shall develop appropriate early
- 19 childhood learning standards for all half-day and full-day
- 20 prekindergarten programs. Districts and charter schools must
- 21 <u>select curricula that align with the commissioner's standards.</u>
- 22 (b-1) Until the commissioner develops early childhood
- 23 <u>learning standards</u>, <u>pre-kindergarten programs shall use existing</u>
- 24 guidelines adopted by the commissioner for purposes of

- 1 instructional materials. This subsection expires September 1,
- 2 2016.
- 3 (c) $[(\frac{b}{b})]$ If a school district contracts with a private
- 4 entity for the operation of the district's prekindergarten program,
- 5 the program must at a minimum comply with the applicable child-care
- 6 licensing standards adopted by the Department of Protective and
- 7 Regulatory Services under Section 42.042, Human Resources Code.
- 8 <u>(d)</u>[(e)] <u>Each teacher or aide assigned to a prekindergarten</u>
- 9 class shall complete 30 hours of early childhood-specific education
- 10 every five years.
- 11 (e) A school district that offers prekindergarten classes
- 12 shall include the following information in the district's Public
- 13 Education Information Management System (PEIMS) report:
- 14 (1) demographic information, as determined by the
- 15 commissioner, on students enrolled in district prekindergarten
- 16 classes, including the number of students who are eligible for
- 17 classes under Section 29.153;
- 18 (2) the numbers of half-day and full-day
- 19 prekindergarten classes offered by the district; [and]
- 20 (3) the number of students enrolled in each half-day
- 21 and full-day prekindergarten class offered by the district;
- 22 (4) the number of teachers and aides assigned to each
- 23 half-day and full-day prekindergarten class;
- (5) the number of hours per week and hours per year for
- 25 each half-day and full-day program offered by the district; and
- 26 (6) (3) the sources of funding for the
- 27 prekindergarten classes.

- 1 (f) The commissioner may make rules to implement this
- 2 <u>section.</u>
- 3 SECTION 3. Add new Section 29.1541, Education Code, to read
- 4 as follows:
- 5 Section 29.1541 Full-day Prekindergarten Programs (a) A
- 6 school district or charter school may receive funding for a
- 7 <u>full-day prekindergarten program for four year old students</u>
- 8 eligible under Section 29.153 as provided by this section.
- 9 (b) A teacher at a prekindergarten program funded as a
- 10 full-day program under this section must meet the requirements
- 11 developed by the State Board for Educator Certification under
- 12 <u>Section 21.1530.</u>
- 13 (c) A full-day prekindergarten program funded under this
- 14 <u>section must maintain a ratio of no more than ten students to a</u>
- 15 teacher or aide and must assign at least one teacher to each
- 16 <u>classroom.</u>
- 17 (d) A district or charter operating a full-day
- 18 prekindergarten program funded under this section must implement a
- 19 local system approved by the commissioner to monitor the progress
- 20 of prekindergarten students through the school year and evaluate
- 21 program effectiveness. The commissioner shall provide multiple
- 22 options to comply with this subsection.
- 23 (e) A district or charter operating a full-day
- 24 prekindergarten program funded under this section must adopt an
- 25 instrument approved by the commissioner to evaluate the readiness
- 26 of all students entering kindergarten and report information
- 27 required by the commissioner through the Public Education

- 1 <u>Information Management System.</u>
- 2 (f) Nothing in this section shall be construed to require a
- 3 district or charter to operate a full-day prekindergarten program,
- 4 or to require compliance with this section in programs funded on a
- 5 half-time basis or full-time programs for ineligible students
- 6 funded with tuition under section 29.1531.
- 7 (g) A school district or charter may contract with a private
- 8 entity to provide a program under this section. A contract for
- 9 services may include the district or charter providing facilities,
- 10 teachers and aides or other services to a private provider. A
- 11 contract for services must ensure that all requirements of this
- 12 section for a full-day prekindergarten program are met by the
- 13 district or charter or the contracting private provider.
- 14 (h) The commissioner may make rules to implement this
- 15 section.
- 16 (i) The commissioner shall evaluate the effectiveness of
- 17 programs operated under this section and report to the legislature
- 18 no later than December 1, 2018. This subsection expires January 1,
- 19 2019.
- 20 (j) A district or charter must apply to the commissioner for
- 21 permission to receive funding for a full-day program operated
- 22 <u>during the 2016-2017 school year. The commissioner may not approve</u>
- 23 applications in an amount that exceeds a total additional state
- 24 cost set by appropriation. The commissioner shall adopt
- 25 application deadlines and prioritize districts with the greatest
- 26 percentage of students who meet the eligibility criteria in section
- 27 29.153 if applications for funding exceed the amount set by

- 1 appropriation. A decision by the commissioner under this
- 2 subsection is final and may not be appealed. This subsection
- 3 expires September 1, 2017.
- 4 SECTION 4. Add new Section 21.1530, Education Code, to read
- 5 as follows:
- 6 Section 21.1530 Prekindergarten requirements. (a) The
- 7 board shall determine appropriate education and professional
- 8 development requirements for teachers and aides in full-day
- 9 prekindergarten programs under Section 29.1541.
- 10 (b) The board may fulfill the requirements of this section
- 11 for teachers by:
- 12 <u>(1) developing an early childhood education</u>
- 13 certificate applicable to prekindergarten and kindergarten, which
- 14 may also apply to grades one through three; or
- 15 (2) developing an endorsement for existing
- 16 certificates that is based on appropriate education requirements to
- 17 <u>enable a teacher to succeed in early childhood education; or</u>
- 18 (3) adopting appropriate education or training
- 19 requirements for early childhood teachers, which may include a
- 20 Child Development Associate Certificate.
- 21 (c) The board may fulfill the requirements of this section
- 22 for aides by adopting appropriate education or training
- 23 requirements for early childhood staff, which may include a Child
- 24 Development Associate Certificate.
- 25 (d) This section only applies to a teacher or aide providing
- 26 instruction to students in a full-day prekindergarten program that
- 27 receives funding under Section 29.1530.

- 1 SECTION 5. Amend Section 25.001(a), Education Code, to read
- 2 as follows:
- 3 Sec. 25.001. ADMISSION. (a) A person who, on the first day
- 4 of September of any school year, is at least five years of age and
- 5 under 21 years of age, or is at least 21 years of age and under 26
- 6 years of age and is admitted by a school district to complete the
- 7 requirements for a high school diploma is entitled to the benefits
- 8 of the available school fund for that year. Any other person
- 9 enrolled in a prekindergarten class under Section 29.153 or 29.1541
- 10 is entitled to the benefits of the available school fund.
- SECTION 6. Amend Section 42.003(b), Education Code, to read
- 12 as follows:
- 13 Sec 42.003(b) A student to whom Subsection (a) does not
- 14 apply is entitled to the benefits of the Foundation School Program
- 15 if the student is enrolled in a prekindergarten class under Section
- 16 29.153 or 29.1541.
- 17 SECTION 7. Implementation. (a) Except as provided in this
- 18 section, this act takes effect September 1, 2015.
- 19 (b) The requirement that teachers and aids assigned to
- 20 prekindergarten programs complete 30 hours of early
- 21 childhood-specific professional education in Section 29.1532(d) as
- 22 added by this act applies:
- 23 (1) to programs funded under Section 29.0541 beginning
- 24 with the 2017-2018 school year; and
- 25 (2) to all other prekindergarten programs beginning
- 26 with the 2019-2020 school year.
- 27 (c) The State Board for Educator Certification shall adopt

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- 1 standards under Section 21.1530 as soon as practicable. Standards
- 2 for prekindergarten staff under Section 21.1530 apply beginning
- 3 with the 2018-19 school year.
- 4 (d) Students enrolled in full-day pre-kindergarten programs
- 5 under Section 29.1541, Education Code, as added by this Act, shall
- 6 be included in funding for the Foundation School Program beginning
- 7 with the 2017-18 school year.
- 8 SECTION 8. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 9 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 10 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 11 Act does not receive the votes necessary for immediate effect, this
- 12 Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
