4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:			
5	SECTION 1.Subtitle C, Title 3, Occupations Code, is amended			
6	by adding Chapter 207 to read as follows:			
7	CHAPTER 207. ANESTHESIOLOGIST ASSISTANTS			
8	Section 207.001. DEFINITIONS. In this chapter:			
9	(1) "Anesthesiologist" means a physician licensed by the			
10	Texas Medical Board who specializes in anesthesiology.			
11	(2) "Anesthesiologist assistant" means a person who holds a			
12	license issued under this chapter.			
13	(3) "Medical board" means the Texas Medical Board.			
14	Section 207.002. LICENSE REQUIRED. A person may not			
15	practice as an anesthesiologist assistant in this state			
16	unless the person holds an anesthesiologist assistant			
17	license issued under this chapter.			
18	Section 207.003. PRACTICE BY A LICENSE HOLDER. (a) Ar			
19	anesthesiologist assistant may assist the supervising			
20	anesthesiologist in developing and implementing ar			
21	anesthesia care plan for a patient consistent with the rules			
22	adopted under this chapter.			
23	(b) Assisting an anesthesiologist does not constitute the			
24	practice of medicine.			

1	(c) Nothing in this chapter shall limit or expand the scope		
2	of practice of physician assistants under other statutes.		
3	Section 207.004. USE OF TERM ANESTHESIOLOGIST		
4	ASSISTANT. (a) A person not licensed under this chapter		
5	that uses the title anesthesiologist assistant or holds		
6	themselves out to be an anesthesiologist assistant commits an		
7	administrative violation under the Occupations Code.		
8	(b) A student in an anesthesiologist assistant training		
9	program shall be identified as a "student anesthesiologist		
10	assistant" or an "anesthesiologist assistant student." A		
11	student in an anesthesiologist assistant training program is		
12	<pre>prohibited from being identified as an "intern," "resident,"</pre>		
13	or "fellow."		
14	Section 207. 004. ISSUANCE OF LICENSE; REQUIREMENTS.		
15	(a) The medical board shall:		
16	(1) Establish qualification for an anesthesiologist		
17	assistant to practice in this state;		
18	(2) Establish requirements for an examination for a		
19	license to practice as an anesthesiologist		
20	assistant in this state;		
21	(3) Establish minimum education and training		
22	requirements necessary for a license to practice		
23	as an anesthesiologist assistant;		
24	(4) Prescribe the application form for a license to		
25	practice as an anesthesiologist assistant; and		
26	(5) Develop an approved program of mandatory		

1		continuing education and the manner in which
2		attendance at all approved courses, clinics,
3		forums, lectures, programs, or seminars is
4		monitored and recorded.
5	(b) As m	inimum requirements for licensure, the board shall
6	ensure an	applicant:
7	(1)	is of good moral character;
8	(2)	submits proof of completion of graduate level
9		training program accredited by the Commission of
10		Accreditation of Allied Health Education Programs
11		or its successor organization;
12	(3)	submits proof of current certification from the
13		National Commission of Certification of
14		Anesthesiologist Assistants or its successor
15		organization, including passage of a
16		certification examination administered by the
17		National Commission of Certification of
18		Anesthesiologist Assistants which must be taken
19		within 12 months after completing training;
20	(4)	pays the required application and licensing fees;
21		and
22	(5)	meets any additional qualifications for licensure
23		adopted by the board by rule.
24	<u>Section 207.005</u>	. LICENSE FEES. The board shall set and collect
25	fees in amounts	that are reasonable and necessary to cover the costs
26	of administering	g and enforcing this chapter without the use of any
27	other funds gene	rated by the medical board.

- 1 Section 207.06. BOARD RULES. The board shall adopt rules to
- 2 implement this chapter that include requirements and limitations on
- 3 the provision of anesthesia services by an anesthesiologist
- 4 assistant as determined by the board to be in the best interests of
- 5 patient health and safety. Rules adopted by the board shall include
- 6 the following requirements:
- 7 (a) an anesthesiologist assistant be supervised by an
 8 anesthesiologist who is actively engaged in clinical
 9 practice and available on-site to provide assistance to
 10 the anesthesiologist assistant;
- 11 (b) <u>limitations on the number of anesthesiologist</u>

 12 <u>assistants and student anesthesiologist assistants an</u>

 13 <u>anesthesiologist may supervise as determined by the</u>

 14 Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services; and
- 15 (c) <u>anesthesiologist assistants shall comply with all</u>
 16 <u>continuing education requirements and recertification</u>
 17 <u>requirements of the National Commission for</u>
 18 <u>Certification of Anesthesiologist Assistants or its</u>
 19 successor organization.
- 20 SECTION 2. This Act applies to an application for an 21 anesthesiologist assistant submitted on or after the effective date
- 22 of this Act. Applications submitted prior to that date are governed
- 23 by the law as it existed immediately before the effective date of
- 24 this Act, and that law is continued in effect for that purpose.
- 25 SECTION 3. As soon as practicable as the effective date of this
- 26 Act, the Texas Medical Board shall adopt all rules necessary to
- 27 implement Chapter 207 as adopted by this Act.
