A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to the verification of employment authorization by
3	governmental entities, state contractors, and state grant
4	recipients, including the use of the federal E-verify program.
5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
6	SECTION 1. Subtitle A, Title 6, Government Code, is amended
7	by adding Chapter 619 to read as follows:
8	CHAPTER 619. VERIFICATION OF EMPLOYEE INFORMATION
9	Sec. 619.001. DEFINITIONS. In this chapter:
10	(1) "E-verify program" means the electronic
11	verification of employment authorization program of the federal
12	Illegal Immigration Reform and Immigrant Responsibility Act of 1996
13	(Pub. L. No. 104-208, reprinted in note, 8 U.S.C. Section 1324a),
14	operated by the United States Department of Homeland Security, or a
15	successor employment authorization program designated by the
16	United States Department of Homeland Security or other federal
17	agency authorized to verify the employment authorization status of
18	newly hired employees under the federal Immigration Reform and
19	Control Act of 1986 (8 U.S.C. Section 1101 et seq.).
20	(2) "Governmental entity" means:
21	(A) the state; or
22	(B) a political subdivision of the state,
23	including a municipality, a county, or any kind of district.
24	Sec. 619.002. VERIFICATION. A governmental entity shall:

1	(1) register and participate in the E-verify program
2	to verify information of all new employees; or
3	(2) verify the employment authorization status of all
4	new employees by requiring each employee to provide an unexpired
5	United States passport or:
6	(A) one of the following documents:
7	(i) an original or certified copy of a birth
8	certificate issued by a bureau of vital statistics for a state;
9	(ii) a Consular Report of Birth Abroad or
10	Certificate of Birth Abroad issued by the United States Department
11	of State;
12	(iii) a Certificate of United States
13	Citizenship issued by the federal Department of Homeland Security
14	or the United States Department of State including an
15	identification photograph; or
16	(iv) a Certificate of Naturalization issued
17	by the federal Department of Homeland Security or the United States
18	Department of State including an identification photograph; and
19	(B) one of the following documents:
20	(i) an unexpired driver's license or
21	identification card issued by a state;
22	(ii) an unexpired federal, state, or local
23	government identification card; or
24	(iii) an unexpired military identification
25	card for active duty, reserve, or retired personnel with an
26	identification photograph.
27	Sec. 619.003. RULES. The Texas Workforce Commission shall

- 1 adopt rules and prescribe forms to implement this chapter.
- 2 SECTION 2. The heading to Chapter 2264, Government Code, is
- 3 amended to read as follows:
- 4 CHAPTER 2264. CERTAIN RESTRICTIONS ON [USE OF CERTAIN] PUBLIC
- 5 SUBSIDIES AND STATE CONTRACTS
- 6 SECTION 3. Section 2264.101, Government Code, is
- 7 transferred to Subchapter B, Chapter 2264, Government Code,
- 8 redesignated as Section 2264.054, Government Code, and amended to
- 9 read as follows:
- 10 Sec. 2264.054 [2264.101]. RECOVERY. (a) A public
- 11 agency, local taxing jurisdiction, or economic development
- 12 corporation, or the attorney general on behalf of the state or a
- 13 state agency, may bring a civil action to recover any amounts owed
- 14 to the public agency, state or local taxing jurisdiction, or
- 15 economic development corporation under this <u>subchapter</u> [chapter].
- 16 (b) The public agency, local taxing jurisdiction, economic
- 17 development corporation, or attorney general, as applicable, shall
- 18 recover court costs and reasonable attorney's fees incurred in an
- 19 action brought under Subsection (a).
- 20 (c) A business is not liable for a violation of this
- 21 <u>subchapter</u> [chapter] by a subsidiary, affiliate, or franchisee of
- 22 the business, or by a person with whom the business contracts.
- SECTION 4. The heading to Subchapter C, Chapter 2264,
- 24 Government Code, is amended to read as follows:
- 25 SUBCHAPTER C. <u>E-VERIFY PROGRAM</u> [<u>ENFORCEMENT</u>]
- SECTION 5. Subchapter C, Chapter 2264, Government Code, is
- 27 amended by adding Sections 2264.1011, 2264.102, 2264.103, and

1 2264.104 to read as follows: Sec. 2264.1011. DEFINITIONS. In this subchapter: 2 (1) "E-verify program" means the electronic 3 verification of employment authorization program of the federal 4 5 Illegal Immigration Reform and Immigrant Responsibility Act of 1996 (Pub. L. No. 104-208, reprinted in note, 8 U.S.C. Section 1324a), 6 7 operated by the United States Department of Homeland Security, or a successor employment authorization program designated by the 8 United States Department of Homeland Security or other federal 9 10 agency authorized to verify the employment authorization status of newly hired employees under the federal Immigration Reform and 11 12 Control Act of 1986 (8 U.S.C. Section 1101 et seq.). (2) "State agency" has the meaning assigned by Section 13 2103.001. 14 15 Sec. 2264.102. VERIFICATION BY CONTRACTORS. (a) A state agency may not award a contract for goods or services within this 16 17 state to a contractor unless the contractor: (1) registers with and participates in the E-verify 18 19 program to verify information of all new employees; or (2) verifies the employment authorization status of 20 all new employees by requiring each employee to provide an 21 22 unexpired United States passport or: (A) one of the following documents: 23 24 (i) an original or certified copy of a birth certificate issued by a bureau of vital statistics for a state; 25 26 (ii) a Consular Report of Birth Abroad or

Certificate of Birth Abroad issued by the United States Department

2	(iii) a Certificate of United States
3	Citizenship issued by the federal Department of Homeland Security
4	or the United States Department of State including an
5	identification photograph; or
6	(iv) a Certificate of Naturalization issued
7	by the federal Department of Homeland Security or the United States
8	Department of State including an identification photograph; and
9	(B) one of the following documents:
10	(i) an unexpired driver's license or
11	identification card issued by a state;
12	(ii) an unexpired federal, state, or local
13	government identification card; or
14	(iii) an unexpired military identification
15	card for active duty, reserve, or retired personnel with an
16	identification photograph.
17	(b) Each contract with a state agency must include the
18	<pre>following statement:</pre>
19	" (name of contractor) certifies that
20	(name of contractor) is not ineligible to receive this
21	contract under Subchapter C, Chapter 2264, Government Code, and
22	acknowledges that if this certification is inaccurate, the
23	contractor may be barred from participating in state contracts."
24	(c) If a state agency determines that a contractor was
25	ineligible to have the contract awarded under Subsection (a), the
26	state agency shall refer the matter to the comptroller for action.
27	(d) Each state agency shall develop procedures for the

1 administration of this section. 2 Sec. 2264.103. BARRING FROM STATE CONTRACTS. (a) Using procedures prescribed under Section 2155.077, the comptroller 3 shall bar a contractor from participating in state contracts if the 4 5 comptroller determines that the contractor was awarded a contract in violation of Section 2264.102. 6 7 (b) Debarment under this section is for a period of one 8 year. 9 Sec. 2264.104. VERIFICATION BY GRANT RECIPIENTS. (a) A 10 state agency may not award a grant unless the grant recipient: 11 (1) registers with and participates in the E-verify 12 program to verify information of all new employees; or (2) verifies the employment authorization status of 13 all new employees by requiring each employee to provide an 14 unexpired United States passport or: 15 (A) one of the following documents: 16 17 (i) an original or certified copy of a birth certificate issued by a <u>bureau of vital statistics for a state;</u> 18 19 (ii) a Consular Report of Birth Abroad or Certificate of Birth Abroad issued by the United States Department 20 21 of State; 22 (iii) a Certificate of United States Citizenship issued by the federal Department of Homeland Security 23 24 or the United States Department of State including an 25 identification photograph; or 26 (iv) a Certificate of Naturalization issued

by the federal Department of Homeland Security or the United States

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1	Donartment of State including an identification photograph, and
1	Department of State including an identification photograph; and
2	(B) one of the following documents:
3	(i) an unexpired driver's license or
4	identification card issued by a state;
5	(ii) an unexpired federal, state, or local
6	government identification card; or
7	(iii) an unexpired military identification
8	card for active duty, reserve, or retired personnel with an
9	identification photograph.
10	(b) Each grant contract or agreement with a state agency
11	<pre>must include the following statement:</pre>
12	" (name of grant recipient) certifies that
13	(name of grant recipient) is not ineligible to receive
14	this grant under Subchapter C, Chapter 2264, Government Code, and
15	acknowledges that if this certification is inaccurate, the grant
16	may be terminated without further payment."
17	(c) If a state agency determines that a grant recipient was
18	ineligible to have the grant awarded under Subsection (a), the
19	state agency shall notify the grant recipient in writing that the
20	grant recipient must comply with Subsection (a) before the 31st day
21	after the date the grant recipient is notified.
22	(d) The state agency shall terminate the grant without
23	further obligation to the grant recipient on the 31st day after the
24	date the grant recipient is notified under Subsection (c) if,
25	before that date, the grant recipient has not provided evidence
26	that the grant recipient has complied with Subsection (a).
27	(e) Each state agency shall develop procedures for the

1 <u>administration of this section.</u>

- 2 SECTION 6. The Texas Workforce Commission and each state
- 3 agency subject to Subchapter C, Chapter 2264, Government Code, as
- 4 amended by this Act, shall develop the rules and procedures
- 5 required under Sections 619.003, 2264.102(d), and 2264.104(e),
- 6 Government Code, as added by this Act, as applicable, not later than
- 7 October 1, 2015.
- 8 SECTION 7. Sections 2264.1011, 2264.102, 2264.103, and
- 9 2264.104, Government Code, as added by this Act, apply only in
- 10 relation to a:
- 11 (1) contract for which the request for bids or
- 12 proposals or other applicable expressions of interest is made
- 13 public on or after the effective date of this Act; and
- 14 (2) grant for which the notice of funds availability
- 15 or of funding opportunity is made public on or after the effective
- 16 date of this Act.
- 17 SECTION 8. This Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
