S.B. No. 1873

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

relating to requiring personnel of abortion facilities and certain other facilities performing abortions to complete training on human trafficking.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

SECTION 1. Chapter 171, Health and Safety Code, is amended by adding Subchapter E to read as follows.

SUBCHAPTER E. EDUCATION AND TRAINING PROGRAMS ON TRAFFICKING OF PERSONS FOR CERTAIN FACILITY PERSONNEL

Sec. 171.081. APPLICABILITY. This subchapter applies to each person who:

(1) is employed by, volunteers at, or performs services under contract with:

(A) an abortion facility licensed under Chapter 245; or

(B) an ambulatory surgical center licensed under Chapter 243 that performs more than 50 abortions in any 12-month period; and

(2) has direct contact with patients of the facility.

Sec. 171.082. EDUCATION AND TRAINING PROGRAMS ON TRAFFICKING OF PERSONS. (a) The executive commissioner of the Health and Human Services Commission by rule shall require a person described by Section 171.081 to complete within a reasonable time after beginning work at the facility the basic education and

3 (b) The Texas Commission on Law Enforcement shall make
4 available to each person described by Section 171.081 the required
5 basic education and training program described by Section
6 1701.258(a), Occupations Code, and the voluntary advanced
7 education, instruction, and training program described by Section
8 1701.258(b), Occupations Code.

9 SECTION 2. Not later than December 1, 2015, the executive
10 commissioner of the Health and Human Services Commission shall
11 adopt the rules required by Section 171.082, Health and Safety
12 Code, as added by this Act.

13 SECTION 3. A person described by Section 171.081, Health
14 and Safety Code, as added by this Act, who is hired, begins
15 volunteering, or begins providing services under contract before
16 September 1, 2015, is not required to comply with Section 171.082,
17 Health and Safety Code, as added by this Act, before September 1,
18 2016.

19 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
20 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
21 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
22 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
23 Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
