4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:	
5	SECTION 1. Subtitle I, Title 3, Estates Code, is amended by	
6	adding Chapter 1357 to read as follows:	
7	CHAPTER 1357. SUPPORTED DECISION-MAKING AGREEMENT ACT	
8	SUBCHAPTER A. GENERAL PROVISIONS	
9	Sec. 1357.001. SHORT TITLE. This chapter may be cited as	
10	the Supported Decision-Making Agreement Act.	
11	Sec. 1357.002. DEFINITIONS. In this chapter:	
12	(1) "Adult" means an individual 18 years of age or	
13	older or an individual under 18 years of age who has had the	
14	disabilities of minority removed.	
15	(2) "Disability" means, with respect to an individual,	
16	a physical or mental impairment that substantially limits one or	
17	more major life activities.	
18	(3) "Supported decision-making" means a process of	
19	supporting and accommodating an adult with a disability to enable	
20	the adult to make life decisions, including decisions related to	
21	where the adult wants to live, the services, supports, and medical	
22	care the adult wants to receive, whom the adult wants to live with,	
23	and where the adult wants to work, without impeding the	
24	self-determination of the adult.	

S.B. No. 1881 (4) "Supported decision-making agreement" is an 1 agreement between an adult with a disability and a supporter 2 3 entered into under this chapter. 4 (5) "Supporter" means an adult who has entered into a 5 supposed decision-making agreement with an adult with a disability. 6 Sec. 1357.003. PURPOSE. The purpose of this chapter is to 7 recognize a less restrictive alternative to guardianship for adults with disabilities who need assistance with decisions regarding 8 daily living but who are not considered incapacitated persons for 9 10 purposes of establishing a guardianship under this title. SUBCHAPTER B. SCOPE OF AGREEMENT AND AGREEMENT REQUIREMENTS 11 12 Sec. 1357.051. SCOPE OF SUPPORTED DECISION-MAKING AGREEMENT. An adult with a disability may voluntarily, without 13 14 undue influence or coercion, enter into a supported decision-making 15 agreement with a supporter under which the adult with a disability authorizes the supporter to do any or all of the following: 16 17 (1) provide supported decision-making, including assistance in understanding the options, responsibilities, and 18 19 consequences of the adult's life decisions, without making those decisions on behalf of the adult with a disability; 20 21 (2) subject to Section 1357.054, assist the adult in accessing, collecting, and obtaining information that is relevant 22 to a given life decision, including medical, psychological, 23 24 financial, educational, or treatment records, from any person; (3) assist the adult with a disability in 25 26 understanding the information described by Subdivision (2); and 27 (4) assist the adult in communicating the adult's

S.B. No. 1881 1 decisions to appropriate persons. 2 Sec. 1357.052. AUTHORITY OF SUPPORTER. A supporter may exercise the authority granted to the supporter in the supported 3 4 decision-making agreement. 5 Sec. 1357.053. TERM OF AGREEMENT. (a) Except as provided by Subsection (b), the supported decision-making agreement extends 6 7 until terminated by either party or by the terms of the agreement. 8 (b) If the Department of Family and Protective Services finds after opportunity for appeal that the adult with a disability 9 10 has been abused, neglected, or exploited by the supporter or if the supporter is found criminally liable for that conduct, the 11 12 supported decision-making agreement is terminated. Sec. 1357.054. ACCESS TO PERSONAL INFORMATION. (a) 13 Α supporter is only authorized to assist the adult with a disability 14 in accessing, collecting, or obtaining information that is relevant 15 to a decision authorized under the supported decision-making 16 17 agreement. (b) If a supporter assists an adult with a disability in 18 19 accessing, collecting, or obtaining personal information, 20 including protected health information under the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act (Pub. L. No. 104-191) or 21 22 educational records under the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act of 1974 (20 U.S.C. Section 1232g), the supporter shall ensure 23 24 the information is kept privileged and confidential, as applicable, and is not subject to unauthorized access, use, or disclosure. 25 26 (c) The existence of a supported decision-making agreement 27 does not preclude an adult with a disability from seeking personal

2	Sec. 1357.055. AUTHORIZING AND WITNESSING OF SUPPORTED		
3	DECISION-MAKING AGREEMENT. (a) A supported decision-making		
4	agreement must be signed voluntarily, without coercion or undue		
5	influence, by the adult with a disability and the supporter in the		
6	presence of two or more subscribing witnesses or a notary public.		
7	(b) If signed before two witnesses, the attesting witnesses		
8	must be at least 14 years of age.		
9	Sec. 1357.056. FORM OF SUPPORTED DECISION-MAKING		
10	AGREEMENT. (a) Subject to Subsection (b), a supported		
11	decision-making agreement is only valid if it is in substantially		
12	the following form:

1 SUBCHAPTER C. DUTY OF CERTAIN PERSONS WITH RESPECT TO AGREEMENT 2 Sec. 1357.101. RELIANCE ON AGREEMENT; LIMITATION OF 3 LIABILITY. (a) A person who receives the original or a copy of a supported decision-making agreement shall rely on the agreement. 4 5 (b) A person is not subject to criminal or civil liability and has not engaged in professional misconduct for an act or 6 7 omission if the act or omission is done in good faith and in 8 reliance on a supported decision-making agreement. Sec. 1357.102. REPORTING OF SUSPECTED ABUSE, NEGLECT, OR 9

10 EXPLOITATION. If a person who receives a copy of a supported 11 decision-making agreement or is aware of the existence of a 12 supported decision-making agreement has reason to believe that the 13 adult with a disability is being abused, neglected, or exploited by 14 the supporter, the person shall report the alleged abuse, neglect, 15 or exploitation to the Department of Family and Protective 16 Services.

SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
