7	CHAPTER 1357. SUPPORTED DECISION-MAKING AGREEMENT ACT			
8	SUBCHAPTER A. GENERAL PROVISIONS			
9	Sec. 1357.001. SHORT TITLE. This chapter may be cited as			
10	the Supported Decision-Making Agreement Act.			
11	Sec. 1357.002. DEFINITIONS. In this chapter:			
12	(1) "Adult" means an individual 18 years of age or			
13	older or an individual under 18 years of age who has had the			
14	disabilities of minority removed.			
15	(2) "Disability" means, with respect to an individual,

- a physical or mental impairment that substantially limits one or 16
- more major life activities. 17
- (3) "Supported decision-making" means a process of 18
- 19 supporting and accommodating an adult with a disability to enable
- the adult to make life decisions, including decisions related to 20
- 21 where the adult wants to live, the services, supports, and medical
- care the adult wants to receive, whom the adult wants to live with, 22
- and where the adult wants to work, without impeding the 23
- self-determination of the adult. 24

1	(4) "Supported decision-making agreement" is an		
2	agreement between an adult with a disability and a supporter		
3	entered into under this chapter.		
4	(5) "Supporter" means an adult who has entered into a		
5	supposed decision-making agreement with an adult with a disability.		
6	Sec. 1357.003. PURPOSE. The purpose of this chapter is to		
7	recognize a less restrictive alternative to guardianship for adults		
8	with disabilities who need assistance with decisions regarding		
9	daily living but who are not considered incapacitated persons for		
10	purposes of establishing a guardianship under this title.		
11	SUBCHAPTER B. SCOPE OF AGREEMENT AND AGREEMENT REQUIREMENTS		
12	Sec. 1357.051. SCOPE OF SUPPORTED DECISION-MAKING		
13	AGREEMENT. An adult with a disability may voluntarily, without		
14	undue influence or coercion, enter into a supported decision-making		
15	agreement with a supporter under which the adult with a disability		
16	authorizes the supporter to do any or all of the following:		
17	(1) provide supported decision-making, including		
18	assistance in understanding the options, responsibilities, and		
19	consequences of the adult's life decisions, without making those		
20	decisions on behalf of the adult with a disability;		
21	(2) subject to Section 1357.054, assist the adult in		
22	accessing, collecting, and obtaining information that is relevant		
23	to a given life decision, including medical, psychological,		
24	financial, educational, or treatment records, from any person;		
25	(3) assist the adult with a disability in		
26	understanding the information described by Subdivision (2); and		
27	(4) assist the adult in communicating the adult's

- 2 Sec. 1357.052. AUTHORITY OF SUPPORTER. A supporter may
- 3 exercise the authority granted to the supporter in the supported
- 4 decision-making agreement.
- 5 Sec. 1357.053. TERM OF AGREEMENT. (a) Except as provided
- 6 by Subsection (b), the supported decision-making agreement extends
- 7 until terminated by either party or by the terms of the agreement.
- 8 (b) If the Department of Family and Protective Services
- 9 finds after opportunity for appeal that the adult with a disability
- 10 has been abused, neglected, or exploited by the supporter or if the
- 11 supporter is found criminally liable for that conduct, the
- 12 supported decision-making agreement is terminated.
- Sec. 1357.054. ACCESS TO PERSONAL INFORMATION. (a) A
- 14 supporter is only authorized to assist the adult with a disability
- 15 <u>in accessing, collecting, or obtaining information that is relevant</u>
- 16 to a decision authorized under the supported decision-making
- 17 agreement.
- 18 (b) If a supporter assists an adult with a disability in
- 19 accessing, collecting, or obtaining personal information,
- 20 including protected health information under the Health Insurance
- 21 Portability and Accountability Act (Pub. L. No. 104-191) or
- 22 educational records under the Family Educational Rights and Privacy
- 23 Act of 1974 (20 U.S.C. Section 1232g), the supporter shall ensure
- 24 the information is kept privileged and confidential, as applicable,
- 25 and is not subject to unauthorized access, use, or disclosure.
- 26 (c) The existence of a supported decision-making agreement
- 27 does not preclude an adult with a disability from seeking personal

- 1 SUBCHAPTER C. DUTY OF CERTAIN PERSONS WITH RESPECT TO AGREEMENT
- 2 Sec. 1357.101. RELIANCE ON AGREEMENT; LIMITATION OF
- 3 LIABILITY. (a) A person who receives the original or a copy of a
- 4 supported decision-making agreement shall rely on the agreement.
- 5 (b) A person is not subject to criminal or civil liability
- 6 and has not engaged in professional misconduct for an act or
- 7 omission if the act or omission is done in good faith and in
- 8 reliance on a supported decision-making agreement.
- 9 Sec. 1357.102. REPORTING OF SUSPECTED ABUSE, NEGLECT, OR
- 10 EXPLOITATION. If a person who receives a copy of a supported
- 11 decision-making agreement or is aware of the existence of a
- 12 supported decision-making agreement has reason to believe that the
- 13 adult with a disability is being abused, neglected, or exploited by
- 14 the supporter, the person shall report the alleged abuse, neglect,
- 15 or exploitation to the Department of Family and Protective
- 16 <u>Services.</u>
- 17 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 18 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 19 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 20 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 21 Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
