 1-18 AN ACT

1-19 relating to the dedication of revenue received from certain court
 1-20 costs to the truancy prevention and diversion fund.

1-21 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

1-22 SECTION 1. Articles 102.015(a) and (g), Code of Criminal
 1-23 Procedure, as added by Chapter 1213 (S.B. 1419), Acts of the 83rd
 1-24 Legislature, Regular Session, 2013, are reenacted to read as
 1-25 follows:

1-26 (a) The truancy prevention and diversion fund is a dedicated
 1-27 account in the general revenue fund.

1-28 (g) The comptroller shall deposit the funds received under
 1-29 this article to the credit of a dedicated account in the general
 1-30 revenue fund to be known as the truancy prevention and diversion
 1-31 fund. The legislature may appropriate money from the account only
 1-32 to the criminal justice division of the governor's office for
 1-33 distribution to local governmental entities for truancy prevention
 1-34 and intervention services.

1-35 SECTION 2. Notwithstanding Chapter 839 (H.B. 6), Acts of
 1-36 the 83rd Legislature, Regular Session, 2013, money dedicated by
 1-37 Article 102.015(g), Code of Criminal Procedure, as added by Chapter
 1-38 1213 (S.B. 1419), Acts of the 83rd Legislature, Regular Session,
 1-39 2013, to the truancy prevention and diversion fund established by
 1-40 Article 102.015, Code of Criminal Procedure, is rededicated by this
 1-41 Act.

1-42 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
 1-43 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
 1-44 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
 1-45 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
 1-46 Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
