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1 AN ACT relating to requirements for the issuance of a driver's license or 2 3 personal identification certificate and to a study on digital 4 identification and proof of licensure. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 5 6 SECTION 1. Section 521.044(a), Transportation Code, as amended by Chapters 1012 (H.B. 2512) and 1105 (H.B. 3787), Acts of 7 the 83rd Legislature, Regular Session, 2013, is reenacted and 8 amended to read as follows: 9 (a) Information provided on a driver's license or personal 10 identification certificate application that relates 11 to the applicant's social security number may be used only by 12 the 13 department or disclosed only to: 14 (1) the child support enforcement division of the 15 attorney general's office; (2) another state entity responsible for enforcing the 16 payment of child support; 17 (3) the United States Selective Service System as 18 provided by Section 521.147; 19 20 (4) the unclaimed property division of the 21 comptroller's office; [or] 22 (5) the Health and Human Services Commission; 23 (6) $\left[\frac{(5)}{(5)}\right]$ the secretary of state for the purposes of 24 voter registration or the administration of elections; or

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(7) an agency of another state responsible for issuing
 driver's licenses or identification documents.

3 SECTION 2. Sections 521.044(b) and (e), Transportation
4 Code, are amended to read as follows:

5 (b) The department shall enter an applicant's social 6 security number in the department's electronic database but may not 7 print the number on the applicant's driver's license <u>or personal</u> 8 identification certificate.

9 (e) The department shall include in the department's 10 legislative appropriations requests and budgets, in quarterly 11 performance reports, and in audits of the department's local 12 offices performance measures on the percentage of complete and 13 correct social security numbers on driver's licenses <u>and personal</u> 14 identification certificates.

15 SECTION 3. Section 521.101(f), Transportation Code, is 16 amended to read as follows:

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(f) A personal identification certificate:

(1) for an applicant who is a citizen, national, or legal permanent resident of the United States or a refugee or asylee lawfully admitted into the United States<u>,</u>[+

21 [(A)] expires on a date specified by the 22 department [if the applicant is younger than 60 years of age; or

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of age or older]; or

[(B) does not expire if the applicant is 60 years

(2) for an applicant not described by Subdivision (1),26 expires on:

27 (A) the earlier of:

No. 1934 1 (i) a date specified by the department; or 2 (ii) the expiration date of the applicant's authorized stay in the United States; or 3 4 (B) the first anniversary of the date of issuance, if there is no definite expiration 5 date for the applicant's authorized stay in the United States. 6 7 SECTION 4. Section 521.142(g), Transportation Code, is amended to read as follows: 8 The department shall [may] require an applicant to 9 (g) provide the applicant's social security number or proof that the 10 11 applicant is not eligible for a social security number [only for a purpose permitted by Section 521.044]. 12 13 SECTION 5. Subchapter I, Chapter 521, Transportation Code, is amended by adding Section 521.183 to read as follows: 14 15 Sec. 521.183. SURRENDER OF DRIVER'S LICENSE OR PERSONAL 16 IDENTIFICATION CERTIFICATE. (a) A person is not entitled to receive a driver's license until the person surrenders to the 17 18 department each personal identification certificate in the person's possession that was issued by this state. 19 20 (b) A person is not entitled to receive a personal identification certificate until the person surrenders to the 21 22 department each driver's license in the person's possession that was issued by this state. 23 SECTION 6. Chapter 411, Government Code, is amended by 24 25 adding Subchapter Z to read as follows: SUBCHAPTER Z. MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS 26 27 Sec. 411.951. STUDY ON DIGITAL IDENTIFICATION AND PROOF OF

1 LICENSURE. (a) The department shall conduct a study:
(1) determining the feasibility of altering state
3 requirements for the issuance of a driver's license to allow a
4 person to use a digital form of a driver's license displayed on an
5 electronic device to prove that the person has a driver's license;
6 (2) evaluating risks to personal information security
7 that a system described by Subdivision (1) might create; and

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8 (3) surveying and evaluating electronic driver's
9 license policies in other states.

10 (b) Not later than September 1, 2016, the department shall 11 submit a detailed report of its findings and recommendations to the 12 legislature.

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(c) This section expires January 1, 2017.

SECTION 7. The changes in law made by this Act apply only to 14 15 a driver's license or personal identification certificate for which 16 an application is submitted on or after the effective date of this Act. A driver's license or personal identification certificate for 17 which an application was submitted before the effective date of 18 this Act is governed by the law as it existed immediately before the 19 20 effective date of this Act, and that law is continued in effect for 21 that purpose.

22 SECTION 8. To the extent of any conflict, this Act prevails 23 over another Act of the 84th Legislature, Regular Session, 2015, 24 relating to nonsubstantive additions to and corrections in enacted 25 codes.

26 SECTION 9. This Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
