## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT

- 2 relating to a study of the economic cost of significant oil and gas
- 3 activity in rural areas of the state.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Chapter 403, Government Code, is amended by
- 6 adding Subchapter R to read as follows:
- 7 SUBCHAPTER R. STUDY OF ECONOMIC COST OF SIGNIFICANT OIL
- 8 AND GAS ACTIVITY IN RURAL AREAS.
- 9 Sec. 403.601. DEFINITIONS. In this subchapter:
- 10 (1) "Rural county" means a county with a population of
- 11 less than 50,000.
- 12 (2) "Significant oil and gas activity" means oil and
- 13 gas operations, including development, production, and waste
- 14 disposal, associated with a recognized oil and gas play that in
- 15 total is producing more than 500,000 barrels of oil per day or two
- 16 billion cubic feet of natural gas per day.
- 17 (3) "Rural area" means an area located in a rural
- 18 county, or contiguous with a rural county, where significant oil
- 19 and gas activity is occurring.
- Sec. 403.602. STUDY OF ECONOMIC COST OF SIGNIFICANT OIL AND
- 21 GAS ACTIVITY IN RURAL AREAS. (a) The comptroller, in conjunction
- 22 with the Texas Railroad Commission, the Texas Department of
- 23 <u>Transportation</u>, the <u>Texas</u> <u>Workforce</u> <u>Commission</u>, the <u>Texas</u>
- 24 Education Agency, the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board,

- 1 and the Texas Health and Human Services Commission, shall conduct a
- 2 study on the economic cost of significant oil and gas activity in
- 3 rural areas of the state.
- 4 (b) In conducting the study, the comptroller shall:
- 5 (1) analyze the amount of local government and state
- 6 revenues generated by the activity;
- 7 (2) analyze the need for increased services or
- 8 <u>infrastructure development related to the activity</u>, including:
- 9 <u>(i)</u> state and county roads;
- 10 (ii) healthcare facilities and workforce;
- 11 <u>(iii)</u> housing;
- (iv) police, fire, and emergency medical
- 13 services; and
- 14 (v) public and higher education.
- 15 (3) assess whether revenues generated by the activity
- 16 at the local level are adequate to address the needs analyzed in
- 17 subsection (b)(2);
- 18 (c) The comptroller shall submit a report on the study to
- 19 the legislature not later than December 1, 2016. The report must
- 20 include a summary of the information resulting from the study and
- 21 recommendations for changes in law or appropriations necessary to
- 22 <u>address shortfalls in needed public services and infrastructure</u>
- 23 development.
- Sec. 403.603. EXPIRATION. This subchapter expires
- 25 September 1, 2017.
- 26 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 27 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as

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- 1 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 2 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 3 Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
