SECTION 1. Title 6, Civil Practice and Remedies Code, is amended by adding Chapter 150A to read as follows:

CHAPTER 150A. DISCOVERY BY GOVERNMENTAL UNIT

150A.001. DEFINITIONS. In this chapter:

Sec. 150A.002. SERMONS Sec. 150A.002. SERMONS PRIVILEGED FROM DISCLUSURE TO GOVERNMENTAL UNIT. A governmental unit may not, in any civil action other civil or administrative proceeding to which the governmental unit is a party, compel the production or disclosure of a written copy or audio or video recording of a sermon delivered by a religious leader during religious worship of a religious organization or compel the religious leader to testify regarding the sermon.
