WHEREAS, The cause of this disorder is unknown, but behavioral intervention can dramatically improve outcomes; early diagnosis and intervention are crucial to ensure effective treatment that can help these valuable members of society use their skills and talents to reach their full potential; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the 84th Legislature of the State of Texas hereby recognize April 2015 as Autism Awareness Month and encourage all Texans to learn more about autism spectrum disorder.
