## CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

2 WHEREAS, Terry County grows more grapes than all the other 3 counties in Texas combined; in 2013, there were approximately 800 4 acres of vineyards in the county, constituting more than 80 percent 5 of the grapes in the state; as many as 3,000 acres of grapes are 6 expected to be planted in the county by the end of 2015 and 10,000 7 acres in the coming years; and

8 WHEREAS, Terry County is part of the High Plains region, 9 which endures many hot days but, at an altitude of over 3,600 feet, 10 enjoys cool summer nights; this drop in temperature slows the pace 11 of ripening and enables the grapes to mature over the growing 12 season, producing a better juice for wine production; and

13 WHEREAS, The region is extraordinarily windy, which reduces 14 problems related to humidity, such as mildew; its soil is sandy clay 15 over a bed of caliche, and these layers allow good drainage down to 16 the bedrock; and

WHEREAS, Many Terry County farmers are agricultural producers whose families have been in the area for generations; they possess unparalleled knowledge of the land and the requisite work ethic to successfully bring a crop to maturity; with each growing season, more acreage is planted with grapes and the farming community's knowledge of grape growing also increases; and

23 WHEREAS, The business community in the county fully supports 24 the grape-growing industry, and a local chamber of commerce held

1 the first Taste of Terry County Vineyard Festival in 2013; and

2 WHEREAS, An increasing number of publications, such as the 3 Wall Street Journal, are recognizing Terry County for its 4 development into a producer of world-class wine grapes; now, 5 therefore, be it

6 RESOLVED, That the 84th Legislature of the State of Texas 7 hereby designate Terry County as the official Grape Capital of 8 Texas; and, be it further

9 RESOLVED, That in accordance with the provisions of Section 10 391.003(e), Government Code, this designation remain in effect 11 until the 10th anniversary of its designation.
