SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION 1 proposing a constitutional amendment to provide for the governor's 2 and lieutenant governor's terms of office to begin at 10 a.m. on the 3 4 day preceding the day the regular legislative session convenes. BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 5 SECTION 1. Section 4, Article IV, Texas Constitution, is 6 7 amended to read as follows: 8 Sec. 4. The Governor elected at the general election in 2018 [1974], and thereafter, shall be installed at 10 a.m. on the day 9 preceding the day set by law for the convening of the regular 10 session of the legislature [first Tuesday after the organization of 11 the Legislature, or as soon thereafter as practicable,] and shall 12 hold [his] office for the term of four years, or until a [his] 13 successor shall be duly installed. The Governor [He] shall be at 14 least thirty years of age, a citizen of the United States, and shall 15 have resided in this State at least five years immediately 16 preceding the [his] election. 17 SECTION 2. Section 16(a), Article IV, Texas Constitution, 18

19 is amended to read as follows:

(a) There shall also be a Lieutenant Governor, who shall be chosen at every election for Governor by the same voters, in the same manner, [continue in office for the same time,] and possess the same qualifications. The voters shall distinguish for whom they vote as Governor and for whom as Lieutenant Governor. The

Lieutenant Governor shall hold office for a term of four years. The 1 Lieutenant Governor shall take office following the election, at 10 2 a.m. on the day preceding the day set by law for the convening of the 3 regular session of the legislature, and shall serve thereafter for 4 the full term of years to which elected. 5 6 SECTION 3. The following temporary provision is added to 7 the Texas Constitution: TEMPORARY PROVISION. (a) This temporary provision applies 8 9 to the constitutional amendment proposed by the 84th Legislature, Regular Session, 2015, providing for the governor's and lieutenant 10 governor's terms of office to begin the day preceding the day the 11 regular legislative session convenes. 12 (b) The amendments to Sections 4 and 16(a), Article IV, of 13 this constitution apply to a person elected to the office of 14 governor or lieutenant governor for a term beginning on or after 15 16 January 1, 2019. 17 (c) This temporary provision expires January 1, 2020. 18 SECTION 4. (a) This proposed constitutional amendment shall be submitted to the voters at an election to be held November 19 20 3, 2015, only if the secretary of state certifies that an enactment

21 of the 84th Legislature, Regular Session:

(1) provides for the canvass of election returns for the offices of governor and lieutenant governor by the attorney general; and

(2) was not vetoed by the governor and becomes law
contingent on adoption of this constitutional amendment by the
voters.

(b) If the secretary of state does not make a certification
under Subsection (a), this resolution has no effect.

3 (c) If the election on this amendment is held, the ballot 4 shall be printed to permit voting for or against the proposition: 5 "The constitutional amendment to provide for the governor's and 6 lieutenant governor's terms of office to begin at 10 a.m. on the day 7 preceding the day the regular legislative session convenes."
