In Memory of Joe Glenn Barton

WHEREAS, A life made rich through meaningful service drew to a close when Constable Joe Glenn Barton of Farmersville passed away on January 10, 2015, at the age of 64; and

WHEREAS, Born on May 5, 1950, in Waxahachie, Joe Barton was the only child of Joe Ab and Billie Gardner Barton; at a young age, he moved with his family to Garland, where he graduated from Garland High School in 1968; he married Eva Hartsell on January 14, 1972, and the couple shared in the joy of raising a daughter together, Jessica Autumn Barton; and

WHEREAS, Constable Barton began his career in law enforcement working as a dispatcher for the McKinney Police Department; during his 14 years there, he distinguished himself in a series of assignments as patrol officer, patrol sergeant, detective sergeant, lieutenant of operations, and interim chief of police; after leaving the force, he began his tenure as Collin County constable for Precinct 2 on January 1, 1989; he was reelected six times and held that office for a total of 26 years; and

WHEREAS, In addition to ably meeting the demands of his professional career, Constable Barton was actively involved in the Farmersville community; he was a longtime member and former president of the Rotary Club, which twice honored him with the Rotary Club Governor's Award for his service; he chaired the Chaparral Rails to Trails committee for close to 20 years, and he also helped to coordinate the 2002 Audie Murphy Day event; moreover, he was a faithful congregant at the First Baptist

Church of Farmersville, and he was a volunteer for Meals on Wheels for well over a decade; in 2003, his exceptional efforts earned him the Harry O. Cameron Citizen of the Year award from the Farmersville Chamber of Commerce; and
