WHEREAS, Career and technical education programs help students build a rewarding future by preparing them for college and teaching them skills that are sought after in a wide variety of professional fields; moreover, these courses are an integral part of the Texas Foundation High School Program, the new state-mandated graduation plan that allows students to earn endorsements, performance acknowledgements, and credentials recognized by industry professionals; and

WHEREAS, The advantages afforded by career and technical education are not just limited to students enrolled in those courses; at a time when business leaders nationwide report

a shortage of applicants in critical and growing fields, career and technical education programs support the development of a dedicated and highly qualified workforce, ensuring the success of American industries and the nation's continued global competitiveness; and
