WHEREAS, Specialist William Moody has become a part of the long line of courageous men and women whose bravery and dedication to duty and honor have left an indelible mark on the world; a young man of courage, strength, and compassion, he gave unselfishly to others, and he was proud to serve his country and protect its security and democratic ideals; and

WHEREAS, He was a devoted son, brother, husband, and father, and he leaves behind memories that will be treasured forever by his family, his many friends, and all who were privileged to share in his life; and
