WHEREAS, Mrs. Burns remained deeply engaged in education and youth enrichment following her retirement; she volunteered in schools, and she served the Texas Retired Teachers Association in many capacities, among them as board member, state health care chair, state convention chair, and district and local president; a powerful advocate for retired educators, she has written more than 200 letters to newspaper editorial boards across the state about important issues; her numerous accolades include the prestigious 2013 E. L. Galyean Service Award from the Texas Retired Teachers Association; moreover, she led the

Adopt-a-School Program of Altrusa International of Lubbock, and she has given generously of her time and talents to the League of Women Voters, the Family Guidance and Outreach Center's Connection Kids, the Twentieth Century Club, and many other groups; and
