**IN RE: HB115** by Dale (Relating to the criteria for awarding the Texas Purple Heart Medal to members of the armed forces wounded or killed at Fort Hood on November 5, 2009.), **As Engrossed**

<p><b>No significant fiscal implication to the State is anticipated.</b></p>

The bill would amend the Government Code as it relates to the awarding of Texas military service medals. Under the provisions of the bill the Governor or Adjutant General, if delegated the authority, could determine criteria for the awarding of the Texas Purple Heart Medal for military members wounded or killed at Fort Hood on November 5, 2009.

The Governor's Office and the Texas Military Department both indicated they did not anticipate any significant fiscal impact as a result of implementing the provisions of the bill.

The bill would take immediate effect if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, or September 1, 2015.

**Local Government Impact**

No significant fiscal implication to units of local government is anticipated.
