**IN RE: HB599** by Clardy (Relating to energy savings performance contracts entered into by public institutions of higher education.), **As Introduced** 

**Estimated Two-year Net Impact to General Revenue Related Funds** for HB599, As Introduced: a negative impact of (\$200,000) through the biennium ending August 31, 2017.

The bill would make no appropriation but could provide the legal basis for an appropriation of funds to implement the provisions of the bill.

## **Fiscal Analysis**

The bill would replace the Higher Education Coordinating Board (THECB) with the State Energy Conservation Office (SECO) with the responsibility of establishing guidelines and approval processes for awarding energy savings performance contracts entered into by public institutions of higher education.

#### Methodology

Under the provisions of the bill, SECO would be required to review and approve energy savings performance contracts. Subsection (i) of Section 51.927, Education Code, currently requires that contracts be reviewed by a licensed professional engineer with a minimum of three years of experience in energy calculation and review.

The Comptroller of Public Accounts, which administers SECO, indicates annual costs of \$100,000 for the purpose of contracting with a licensed professional engineer to review proposed energy savings performance contracts. The agency anticipates conducting technical and engineering reviews of approximately two to three contracts each year.

## **Local Government Impact**

No significant fiscal implication to units of local government is anticipated.
