IN RE: HB679 by Turner, Sylvester (Relating to a study on homeless youth.), As Introduced

No significant fiscal implication to the State is anticipated.

The bill amends the Government Code relating to a study on homeless youth. The bill directs the Department of Housing and Community Affairs (TDHCA), in conjunction with the Department of Family and Protective Services (DFPS), the Texas Education Agency (TEA), and the Texas Homeless Education Office, to conduct a study on homeless youth and submit a report to the legislature including a summary of information and recommendations for changes to law necessary to provide services to or otherwise assist homeless youth. Based on the analysis of TDHCA, DFPS, and TEA, duties and responsibilities associated with implementing the provisions of the bill could be accomplished by utilizing existing resources.
