IN RE: HB989 by Frullo (Relating to defenses and exceptions to the prosecution of the criminal offense of the possession, manufacture, transport, repair, or sale of certain prohibited explosive weapons, firearms, and related items.), **As Introduced**

The bill would amend the Penal Code to indicate certain weapons are permissible to possess, manufacture, transport, repair, or sell, if registered with a certain federal registry or classified as a curio or relic by the United States Department of Justice. This analysis assumes the provisions of the bill would not result in a significant impact on state correctional agencies.
