IN RE: HB1059 by Turner, Chris (Relating to the contents of and public access to personal financial statements filed by public officials and candidates.), **As Introduced**

No significant fiscal implication to the State is anticipated.

The bill would amend Government Code to reduce the threshold of reporting of a personal financial statement and to the Ethics Commission. The bill would also require the Ethics Commission to make the personal financial statements available on the Commission's website within 15 days after the statement is filed or required to be filed. The agency indicates that it could absorb the costs associated with the bill within its current resources.

The bill would take effect immediately upon receiving two-thirds majority vote in each house. Otherwise, the bill would take effect September 1, 2015.

Local Government Impact

No fiscal implication to units of local government is anticipated.
