IN RE: HB1173 by Villalba (Relating to school marshals for public junior colleges, notifying a parent or guardian whether an employee of a public junior college is appointed school marshal, and the confidentiality of information submitted to or collected by the Texas Commission on Law Enforcement in connection with a certification for appointment as school marshal.), **Committee Report 1st House, Substituted**

No fiscal implication to the State is anticipated.

Local Government Impact

The bill would amend the Code of Criminal Procedure, Education Code, and Occupations Code relating to school marshals for public junior colleges, notifying a parent or guardian whether an employee of a public junior college is appointed school marshal, and the confidentiality of information submitted to or collected by the Texas Commission on Law Enforcement in connection with a certification program for appointment as a school marshal. Based on information provided by a sample of public junior college districts, duties and responsibilities associated with implementing the provisions of the bill could be accomplished by utilizing existing resources.
